All Mid Canada Senators were saddened to hear of the death in January of one of our most active Senators - Doug Pollard 2099. Doug was an inspiration for many of us, particularly when we were neophyte members of the Winnipeg Jaycees. President Dennis Dempsey 15351 recalls that Doug always spoke with thought and intelligence – one listened and learned by his words and his example. I personally recall a meeting for prospective members in 1960 at which Doug provided the history of the Jaycee movement and more particularly, the accomplishments of the Winnipeg unit. That single speech had me hooked and I have been involved with JCI ever since. While an active Jaycee Doug was instrumental in establishing Junior Achievement in Manitoba, the first such group outside the USA; and was a driving force in the establishment of a Chair of Commerce at the University of Manitoba. He is survived by his wife Anne and two sons. Eight Mid Canada Senators shared stories and remembrances of him at his memorial service on January 30.
