I have reviewed our Terms of Reference. Two minor changes will be proposed at the Crew Meeting in Kingston. They are:

6 - 5: The Finance Committee shall review the financial operations of the Senate for the previous year, prepare and present a report to the Annual Meeting as a result of that review and prepare a proposed budget for the next fiscal year.

Change to read: 6 - 5 **The Finance advisor**, shall review Etc.

6 – 10: That travel, registration and four night's accommodation be paid for the President or his representative for the full JCI Canada/JCI du Canada National Convention.

Change to read: 6 – 10: That partial registration (Friday/Saturday) and two night's accommodation be paid for the President or his representative for the JCI Canada/JCI du Canada National Convention. Travel reimbursement shall be paid at the current CRA (Canada Revenue Agency) allowable vehicle rate per kilometer up to a maximum of 800 km.

One of the more exciting things this year was getting a group of Victoria Senators to bid to host the 2011 Crew Meeting. Because of the timing of our meeting, we had to stray from the regular site selection method and resort to an E-Mail vote. I would like to thank those many Senators who not only supported our move, but unanimously supported the bid.

My travels took me to Vernon and Vancouver for JCI meetings as I continued to work on the relationship between the two organizations. Senate wise, I attended the US JCI Senate mid-year meeting in Kissimmee, Florida as well as a meeting of the 2011 Crew Meeting in Victoria, B.C.

My life style changed considerably as I experienced my first year of retirement. My involvement with the Senate Executive was a great transition from my life in the work force. It has been great serving this organization as Vice President.

I hope to see a lot of you in Kingston & to all those who cannot be there, thank you for your support and encouragement.

I now have only one article on hand of "The Road We Travel" for the Canada JCI Senate Newsletters for June 2010. For the comments that have been received, members of the Canada JCI Senate are really enjoying the articles that we have received and published in the past. I now challenge all Senators and Maple Leafs who have not submitted an article to take the time for the rest of us to read about them in the Newsletter. Tell us how you got involved in the JCI organization, the community you live in and what inspired you to become active in this great organization.

Senator Bernard J Stevens 2038

I first became involved with the Jaycee movement in 1954 when a close friend, Steve Prosenyak 1365 invited me to attend a Quebec City Junior Board of Trade dinner meeting. The guest speaker was Monty Aldous 272, President of the Canada Junior Chamber. His presentation convinced me that I should become a member immediately.

I was soon involved in the annual Safe Driving Rodeo, the Barrel Race as an event during the Quebec Winter Carnival. The club sponsored a duchess (contestant for Carnival Queen), Effective Speaking Etc. Finding the comradeship and activities exhilarating, I moved through various positions up to President. I carried on through the Executive of Region X1V which eventually became the Quebec Junior Chamber. There were only four English Jaycee Units in Quebec at the time, Montreal Junior Board of Trade, Dorval Jaycees, Pointe Claire Jaycees and the Quebec City Junior Board of trade. While I was President two new units were chartered, Sherbrooke and Rouyn-Noranda. They were followed by Roxboro and West Island. During this period I received encouragement, advice and support from Ross Smythe 37, Leo McKenna 83, Charles Blais 1079, George Leebosh 2004 and many others.

The 1961 National Convention in Montreal allowed me to move up to VP, a period when the Commission System was being introduced. The following year in Calgary I was honored to be elected President. The experience of Jaycee participation, the many enthusiastic young Jaycees I came to know and work with across Canada, many of them JCI Senators, helped me concededly in my working career from Sales Rep to Senior Management in the food industry.

Reg Dorrett 2590 introduced me to Camping after the convention. With a few days to spare we drove to Banff Park, 4 adults and 4 kids in the car. We pitched the tent in pouring rain and had it collapse under 7 inches of snow at 2:00 am on the 6th of July. Needless to say I have never camped since.

A few days later I proceeded to my first Unit visit with the Duncan Jaycees, followed by Victoria Jaycees and Vancouver Jaycees before heading home with a stop in Winnipeg. My first ever trip to Western Canada. I had the opportunity to meet with Jaycees in all Provinces except PEI. Got snow bound in St. John's NL, and had to phone Ted LeBlanc 2946 to fill in for me at a scheduled Dinner Meeting with the Halifax Board of Trade.

La Federation des Chambre de Commerce du Quebec represented approximately half of the 25,000 Jaycee members in the early 60's. Being fluently bi-lingual I was able to attend many of their functions. At a Dinner Meeting in Riviera Du Loup

I was introduced as "Bernice" Stevens. Lo and behold as the evening progressed, a few notes (In fun) arrived at the head table containing strange invitations. Luckily my wife wasn't with me. I wonder how many Canadians are aware that La Federation instigated the movement for a truly Canadian flag that did not have a symbol of another country on it. Thus in 1964 the Canadian Government adopted the current Maple Leaf Flag. In the mid 60's it was a disappointment when La federation withdrew from the Canada Jaycees.

Moving to Toronto in 1967 I neglected contact with the Jaycees until I retired in 1986 and moved back to Montreal and joined the Montreal JCI Senate Club where I became aware that the late Phil Pugsley Senator 2's wife Marion Pugsley had in 1984 donated \$1000.00 to the club to be used as seen fit. The Phil Pugsley Memorial Foundation was set up to raise money with the view that when it reached \$10,000. We would re-invest 60% of earnings and use 40% for grants to help Jaycees in the area of Leadership Training, Effective Speaking and Unit Extension. Our target was reached in 1988. As Treasurer & Awards Chairman I had the pleasure of granting the first four Phil Pugsley Memorial Awards of \$125.00 each to Prince George, Thorold, Kingston and Windsor Jaycees.

The Ottawa Area Jaycees had initiated the Canada Jaycee Foundation. About 1994 their Chairman John Jed 14801 was in touch with Leo McKenna 83 regarding possible amalgamation of our efforts. Leo and I made several trips to Ottawa that resulted in amalgamation under the Canada Jaycee Foundation with approximately \$14000.00 from Montreal and \$19000.00 from Ottawa. The Awards would henceforth be known as Phil Pugsley Awards. Both Foundations were represented on the new Board. The following were on the team of 1999: Cecil Bechamp 17849, George Brehn 28794, Doug Burns 15056, Bill Diamond 57690, John Jed 14801, Pete Kennedy 7876, Gordon Lowry 6727, Andy Lyons 23119, Aggie Semenchuck 31504 and Bernie Stevens 2038.

In 2005 we recognized that it was time to turn over the Foundation to a younger generation and have it administered by the Canada JCI Senate. By this time Awards granted exceeded \$100,000.00, while the investments being managed were close to a half million. Bill Diamond and Doug Burns are still very active participants. I am very thankful for all the help, guidance and experience gained through my association with the Canada Jaycees.

It was February 2009 when President Al Murphy called to ask if I would be the Canadian JCI Senate Ambassador to the US JCI Senate, I was rather hesitant at the time and I needed a month to officially accept the position. Looking back now I wish to thank Al for calling me with the offer as I have had a very interesting/enjoyable year.

They teased me through the whole year incessantly. My other leg of support was in the form of Past US JCI Senate Ambassador to Canada, Bruce Geddes 35527. Bruce had all the answers for me when I needed them.

In twelve months I was able to bring greetings from Canada to Kentucky on two occasions, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Ohio. At every one of these stops, I felt treated like royalty, spoiled with gifts and filled my belly with the best of food and drink available in that region. Turned out not to be such a bad job after all!!

I hope to share some of my stories with you at the 2010 Crew Meeting but suffice it to say that I experienced a lot and enjoyed the hospitality tremendously. My only regret is that I do not have an endless amount of booty to visit other areas further than Region Five in the US. There is so much to learn from other Senators in different locations. The summer may see me in Michigan and Illinois as a few of us from the London JCI Senate hit the golf tours run by these states as fund raisers. It is just another reason to meet with my counterpart and supporter - Phyllis Bowers 51430 the US JCI Senate Ambassador to Canada.

I'd like to share a bit of my experience with Fred. As a Winnipeg Jaycee in the 60's he was the epitome of the era. Always dressed in a white shirt and tie, his words were well chosen and spoken clearly to anyone who would listen. He had the respect of many. He was President of Winnipeg Jaycees 1960-61, after sitting on the Board of Directors and chairing many committees.

Fred was the General Manager of Winnipeg Central Steam Heating on Dorchester Avenue. This organization had a coal fired furnace that created steam which was distributed through wooden lined pipes underground to many homes in the Crescentwood area. My childhood home at 12 Ruskin Row was one of them. Coincidentally my Aunt worked as Fred's Secretary for many years.

As a member of the St. James Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion's 'Sick Committee' Fred visited and assisted veterans providing them information and helped them in their needs.

During his retirement Fred was also a volunteer advisor (VAS) for CESO, Canadian Executives Services Organization. Fred spent countless hours assisting Aboriginal people in Manitoba and NW Ontario on the importance of accounting and providing regular financial statements to insure the success of their business. Fred had been a volunteer with CESO since 1990 and on June 4, 2006 was presented with the 'Raymond Simard Member of Parliament Award for Volunteerism'.

A Remembrance of Jerry Shears 3889 - By Douglas Burns 15056

My own career with Jaycees began in the early '60's as a member of the Montreal Junior Board of Trade's highly successful Public Speaking Course, and in the year 1970-71, I became President of the unit. However, I was also busy trying to manage a demanding career with The Seagram Company Ltd, and raising a young family of four, coaching them in sports teams, camping with them and trying to fulfill the role of father and mentor. So I backed off my involvement with Jaycees for a few years.

Until in 1983, Jerry Shears came to visit me in my office and introduced himself (he looked my name up in the Canada Jaycee Directory) and asked me if I would help him on the organizing committee for the 1984 XXXIX JCI World Congress to be hosted in Montreal. How could I resist Jerry, the ever-smiling charmer? The 1984 World Congress was both an artistic and a financial success, thanks to some major sponsorship's from local business in Montreal. So successful that the profits from the Congress were added to a small investment fund owned by the Canada JCI Senate named for Phil Pugsley. This became the Canada JCI Senate Investment Fund that continues to provide funding to Jaycee chapters and their members in Canada to encourage their development. The Fund is now over half a million dollars, even after to effects of the recent disastrous recession.

Thus, my continuing activities with the Canada JCI Senate as Chair of the Investment Committee all began due to the persuasion and charm of Jerry Shears. But my involvement with Jerry continued on for many years. As you know, or have read, Jerry was a successful boxer and at one time was his weight class champion in the Canadian Army. (Barney, I guess you were too young to take him on!) But even more importantly, he was what is known as a "builder" in amateur boxing, as founder of the Canadian Amateur Boxing Association (CABA) and a Vice President of the Association Internationale de Boxe Amateur (AIBA).

In connection with Jerry's involvement with CABA and AIBA, I spent many hours over a number of years with Jerry assisting him in his efforts to write coaching and refereeing manuals, and scoring systems for judging boxing matches. Jerry had very little formal education and struggled to write proper English. But he was always very clear in his head about

what he wanted to say and write. As I got to know him better, I got to read his mind better, and was able to help him to translate his thoughts and ideas into the reports, letters, manuals and guidelines that he wanted to create.

When I sometimes traveled locally with Jerry by car, I was somewhat nervous, as he drove his car like he boxed, bobbing and weaving, lunging and retreating. I laughed about it afterwards! As in boxing, Jerry usually managed to navigate and survive the obstacles. During the years that I knew him, he also traveled the world as a boxing official on assignment for CABA or AIBA, and as an instructor. Because of his generosity of spirit and likeable nature, he was in demand and made and kept friends wherever he went, whether it was in Japan and the Far East, remote Bhutan, or the Arabic Middle East during some of the usual Arabic-Israeli conflicts and standoffs. He adjudicated amateur boxing competitions, held coaching seminars, and made friends for Canada, for Jaycees and for the cause of the purity of amateur boxing. He fought hard to keep the negative aspects of professional boxing from influencing the amateur game.

I liked Jerry for his friendly smile beaming at you through his usual puffy eyes, square-set jaw and flattened nose. He was generous to all, often expressing his appreciation to those who assisted him with small gifts brought back from the many countries he visited on AIBA business. He always had good words to say about his friends and associates. As his son said at his funeral, he would give you the shirt off his back.

I admired Jerry Shears for his honesty, sincerity and actions that, in my mind, exemplify the true spirit of Jaycees.
