It is with a very heavy heart that I start this, my first Newsletter report as your President. Since the distribution of the last Newsletter we have lost 11 Senators and 1 Maple Leaf. While I did not know all those who passed, suffice it to say that they were adjudged to be worthy of a Senatorship by their peers and consequently valued members of our organization. Our condolences to their families and also to those close friends they had through our own Jaycee family. We will remember them.

My theme this year is "Return the Favour". A long time ago someone accorded you a great favour by inviting you to become a Jaycee. You obviously found the invitation appealing as you stayed around long enough to be honored with a Senatorship. Well, the time has come when I am asking you to return that favour. The Canada Jaycees (JCI Canada as they are now called) are in dire straits. Membership is way down. The interest of the young people who are in Jaycees today is as high as ours once was...but they are unable to do it alone. We can't wait for them to ask for help. We were proactive in our day...why not now?

From time to time I will salute a Senator or group who return the favour by doing something to assist the Jaycees. Dear Barney. I am sorry for being so neglectful in answering your request for “The Road We Travel”. I found an envelope addressed to you on my “net” desk from more than two months ago. I have talked to Senator Albert H Fast 310 in Ottawa a few times. He is at a senior’s residence there. We have now moved to cold Ottawa to a senior’s residence from the sun parlor of Canada. We have moved to The Royaltown Retirement Residence in Kanata which is a suburb of Ottawa. My wife Patricia has started into dementia and our children though we should leave the sun parlor since two of our children live in Ottawa and will look after our needs better.

I am also on my way with becoming forgetful and aged. I think of all the good times we have spent in Jaycees in Windsor, the Conventions in Halifax, Toronto, Hamilton and Paris at the World Congress in 1960 and all over Western Ontario. We had a great delegation of 18 members and some wives from Windsor that flew with the St. Catharines group to Paris. My

experience in Jaycee's had been great and has had an impact on my life. I still know the Jaycee Creed and live by "Service to humanity is the best work of life" to this day.

During my first experience in Jaycees, they were talking about painting and grooming some person's house. Being new, I said "that would be a great idea". All of a sudden I was Chairman of Paint a House committee. It was a great lesson learned in many ways. The house was all painted, the yard cleaned up, the bushes trimmed, the fence painted and windows washed in seven hours with 30 workers. All the new paint brushes were cleaned like new and the paint store that donated the supplies, not expecting them back, threw them in the garbage.

I joined Jaycees about three weeks after I got married. As a result Patricia says that she didn't see me again for eight years. We had five children during that time. I must have come home sometimes. I held many different offices and to the credit of the President's Office. As Past President, I had been involved with the Detroit, Michigan Jaycees in procuring the Canadian and US Conventions to Detroit concurrently. It didn't work out. It might have been a disaster as we lost out on our bid in Halifax, NS to Chicoutimi, QC over a 25 cent extra dues charge as they wanted everything printed in French. They won the bid. I dropped out of Jaycees shortly after.

We went to the National Convention in Atlanta, Georgia and the TOYM (Ten Outstanding Young Men) where we went to all the State room caucuses to push for the National Convention to be held in Detroit, Michigan. Something you may remember is Windsor's portable bar in the Hamilton and Toronto Conventions. The bid for the National Conference was in Halifax. I can talk a whole page on the Halifax convention.

In Paris in 1960, the International Convention was held. After 6 of 7 days, we left for the French and Italian Rivera's. The days we passed on the Riviera were cruel and cool since there were no girls on the beach. We drove onto Rome, then up through Switzerland, Austria, Germany, Luxembourg, Belgium, then crossed the English Channel and home after three weeks.

Detroit got their bid for the Michigan Convention. The delegates used up every hotel and motel in Windsor and the surrounding areas. It was a good thing we lost our bid. Years after, I received a call to come to the next Jaycee meeting in Windsor because Chicoutimi dropped out and refused to take the Convention all over 25 cents. Our members declined to take on the Convention at that late date. National was quite upset by this and I was to get our club interested in this endeavor again and I was successful.

When the Convention actually was held in Windsor, I was seated at the head table. It turned out to be a fine convention. Sometime way back, I was honored with being a lifetime member of Jaycees and later awarded JCI Senator 2191. That was a long time ago.

Oh yes, all of our fine five children received degrees in University and are doing very well. I have Patricia to thank for raising these five citizens. I was either at work, night and day, working at a family business of funeral directors or at some community meeting.

Patricia and myself after the kids were old enjoyed many trips. Along with Past President of JCI, Rotary and Funeral conventions, I was Past President of Ontario and of Western Ontario FDA (Funeral director's Association). I was also Co-Chairman of Windsor's 100th Centennial year 1967. It was a 26 hours a day job and again special thanks to Patricia for all the missed family events and special children's functions. She was a prize.

We are now moving to Ottawa on April 1st as we are both getting on in age and two of our five children live there and four of our eleven grandchildren. This letter to Barney was just to be a few lines. I would like to request that my name be removed from the Canada JCI Senate Newsletter mailing list as I am "over the hill". I just recognized a few of the names in the past Newsletters – Murray T Grit 1757 of Welland, Allan May 6861 now of Whitby and Albert H Fast 310 of Ottawa and Barney 14018 of course. Enclosed is a long waited cheque for some of the past mail postage. I will forward my new address shortly in case you find yourself in Ottawa Barney.

Lindsay's favorite project was the Jaycee Fair in Victoria in which she engulfed herself everyday, she was on every committee involved with this project and was very hands on. She loved Victoria and the Jaycees so much.

Lindsay retired at 57 and moved to Kitchener, Waterloo where she lived for the last 8 years. She moved to be with her children and grandchildren. She had four grandchildren all boys and she has a son Rodney and wife Korisha. She was not very happy in Ontario as she was born in Victoria and missed it so very much.

Lindsay was one of my best friends and we had so much fun and laughter together. We were always seen heading for shopping adventures in the USA /Bellingham for a four day weekend each June. We had so much fun and her laugh I will always remember for a life time it was so funny and made me laugh even more. She was a dear friend and we talked all the time on the phone. I spoke with her last week and I remembered to say that I loved her like a sister; and now am so glad I did. I remember working on Bob's campaign for President of JCI Canada at a national Regina convention. Bob presented me with my JCI Senatorship in 1966 at the Ontario Convention in Hamilton.
