The Road We Travel

I now have only one article on hand of "The Road We Travel" for the Canada JCI Senate Newsletters for August 2010. So come on any Senators between 143 and the latest, you now have the time to sit down and compose an article for future Newsletters starting in September 2010. For the comments that have been received, members of the Canada JCI Senate and JCI Canada are really enjoying the articles that we have received and published in the past. I now challenge all Senators and Maple Leafs who have not submitted an article to take the time for the rest of us to read about them in the Newsletter. Tell us how you got involved in the JCI organization, the community you live in and what inspired you to become active in this great organization.

Senator Donald G Lawson 2468

In 1950, having failed my third year of Commerce & Finance (I called my course Honour Student Council and Bridge with a Commerce option), I joined Moss, Lawson & Company, Members of the Toronto Stock Exchange. Stanley Smith, our Assistant Office Manager, was a member of the Toronto Junior Board of Trade. He invited me to join, which I did.

Actually, there was a bit of family history. My father, Frank Lawson, had been one of the original members of the Board of Trade Club. Around 1930, he and a few others decided that if the Club was good for them as young men in business, a replication would be a good thing for the next generation. As a result their leadership led to the creation of the Toronto Junior Board. For me, joining that was a natural thing to do. Through my Student Council experience, I also learned that those active in leadership were people worth knowing so becoming involve in the TJBT was a given.

Brad Heintzman was Chairman. He was succeeded by Harry Smith who went on to become a National President. The TJBT had a membership of 650 and was a very active place. In 1951-52, Joe Barnicke was Chairman of Region 5, Southern Ontario. I joined Joe, Harry Smith, and Doug Allen in attending the Regional Convention in Windsor. The next year, Joe became a member of the TJBT Executive in charge of Special Events. He asked me to join him and together we ran dances and a golf tournament. Through that, I became known well enough to be elected to the Executive. I served in various jobs including 1st Vice President, but lost the election for President to Leith Kennedy.

During this same period I became involved in leadership roles at the North Toronto YMCA, and also became a member of some of the United Way Budget Committees. At the time of losing the election, I got married to my wife of now 53 years, Lorraine. I also advanced to more responsible roles in the YMCA and joined an important committee at the Toronto Stock Exchange.

In 1962 or 63, David McDonald asked me to fill in a vacancy on the TJBT Executive with particular emphasis on Leadership Training. I introduced a course in group dynamics and subsequently Bill Tynkaluk and I went to some of our neighboring Jaycee chapters to introduce the training to them. This drew my membership in the TJBT and Jaycee career to a close, but on retiring, I was presented with Senatorship 2468.

Life was never dull. In 1965 I took over as President of Moss, Lawson & Co. Limited. While still involved with the Toronto YMCA, I also was elected as a Governor of the Toronto Stock Exchange, where I served for eight years, finishing as Chairman of the Board of Governors. In 1971, the YMCA called and vaulted me into Chairman of that Board. The Y was in financial difficulty and needed new blood. The budget was \$3 million and there was a \$200,000 deficit. It was a metropolitan organization with an overall Board of Directors, and 11 branches each with their own board. We were told by staff that if we tried to cut the budget we would destroy the program. It was a very difficult dilemma. We decided to totally restructure the organization by disbanding the branch boards and centralizing leadership in the Metro board. It was like getting on a merry-go-round and reaching for the brass ring. We either succeeded or went bankrupt. We succeeded and today the YMCA of Greater Toronto is a \$150 million organization with a string of new full facility family centers, the largest day care operation in Canada, and lots more.

When the YMCA decided to proceed with the construction of a new centre in North York in 1978, we immediately had to go out on a \$20 million fund raising project. By my going out and telling a story in around fifty or more calls on major corporations we obtained some precedent setting donations. That success led Victoria University (Toronto) to enlist me in their capital campaign. That led to eight years as a member of their Board of Regents.

Somewhere along the way was a stint on the Board of The Big Sister Association of Metropolitan Toronto (the operator of Youth Link). That included leading a labour negotiating committee tasked with developing an original union contract with the newly organized staff. After spending every Friday morning for a year and the inevitable late night session, we got the job done. Thirty years were spent initially as a Director including three years as President, and then Corporate Secretary of the Briars Golf Club. Volunteering, philanthropy, our Church, and business have gone on hand in hand throughout my life.

In 1984, my father Frank Lawson died, leaving his estate to The Counseling Foundation of Canada, something he had created in 1959. His philanthropic interest was Career Counseling. He had been funding the establishment of Career Counseling Centres in Universities and convinced York University to include practical counseling in their Psychology courses. All of a sudden we had to become organized to administer a substantial legacy. We had to organize a Board, develop goals and objectives, and figure out how to wisely distribute about \$1.5 million per year. I inherited the role of Chairman and continue as such to this day. As we grew our asset base, our giving quota also grew, always in the field of career counseling. That has grown to include early childhood development, youth at risk and mentoring, all of which affect a person's employability and career success.

The Foundation is a leader in its chosen field and now grants across Canada. It was responsible for creating a web site "Contact Point", which is the site for career practitioners across Canada, and now internationally. Next was the creation of an annual national congress "Cannexus" which this year attracted close to 650 registrants. The next generation, Frank Lawson's grandchildren, and their spouses are now fully involved and will take over when I retire.

In 1989, HSBC Securities (Canada) acquired Moss, Lawson & Co. I became Honorary Chairman until retirement in mid 2008. 58 years in the business. Along the way, I was awarded The Fellowship of Honour by YMCA Canada and Doctorates from Dalhousie University and Victoria University in Toronto.

It has been a great life, a strong marriage to Lorraine, four wonderful children and eight grandchildren. Maybe to top it all off, I caught a 5 pound 2 ounce small mouth black bass in August 2009, the largest such bass caught in about 90 years of recorded history at the Iron City Fishing Club in Georgian Bay.
