For the comments that have been received, members of the Canada JCI Senate and JCI Canada are really enjoying the articles that we have received and published in the past. I now challenge all Senators and Maple Leafs who have not submitted an article to take the time for the rest of us to read about them in the Newsletter. Tell us how you got involved in the JCI organization, the community you live in and what inspired you to become active in this great organization.

Senator William T (Bill) Macklem 2106

I was born in Windsor, Ontario on January 5, 1924, the same day Walter P Chrysler introduced his first car at the New York City Auto Show.

We moved to North Ridge where I went to grad school and high school in Essex. In 1942 I returned to Windsor and a job with Welles Corp (Wayne School Busses) and married Nancy Hedrick in 1945. We moved into our new home in nearby LaSalle in 1950.

My brother Norm was in Jaycees and my close neighbor Gordon Crapper 445 invited me to join. We had a very active club. Some of the outstanding members were Donald Carlisle 201, Maurice Coughlin 1131, Charlie Gordon 1129, Gordon Lanspeary 1137, Duke Marnock 1138, Bill Morgan 555, Cam Ritchie 1133, Frank Walton 1134, Jack Wheelton 5082, Stewart Anderson 22, Bert Fast 310, Jack McIntyre 1132, Herb Naylor 913, Reg Wilson 1135 and Bill Gatfield 1136.

Each year we held an International Night Meeting at the Spiffy Elmwood Casino. Jaycees attended from Ohio, Michigan and many from Detroit. George Fraser 2750 told me he fondly remembers. My first Region 5 convention was in Welland. I learned how to party and live on two hours sleep. Several members and I chartered the Windsor Jaycee Toastmasters Club

In 1954, I was sent to Regina for a three month sales assignment. I attended the National Convention and running for President were Dave Holem 306 (Calgary), Monty Aldous 272 (Victoria) and Stu Anderson 22 (Windsor). Even with my help and the support of his beauty Queen wife Norma, we lost out to Monty. I remember meeting Reg Dorrett 2590.

September 1954 I was transferred to Edmonton and later opened my Wayne Bus Dealership (Pioneer Bus & Body Ltd).

In 1957 I was elected District President and served as Executive VP under Alberta President Gunnar Eggertson 1831.

In 1955 the Toronto Junior Board of Trade organized a Grey Cup Train special, stopping at key cities along the way to Vancouver. When they stopped here, our members met the train at about 7:00 AM. We worked them up with Vodka and Juice. A number of us got carried away and joined the trip to the big game.

In 1958 the National Convention was in Victoria, BC. A group of us attended and put in a bid for 1959. It was awarded to Saskatoon. Ken MacDonald 3028 was our team leader. Later that same year I went to Minneapolis for the World Congress and it was a great experience. Doug Wight 1370 and Joyce were there from Calgary.

The Edmonton Unit had several annual events including Muk Luck Mardi Gras Winter festival, School Patrol Picnic for all students who worked as Safety Guards at street crossings, and the Oktoberfest Beer Garden.

We had many interesting meetings at the old Seven Seas Restaurant on Jasper Avenue. One time a large group of Calgary Jaycees showed up for a visitation. One of them entered the meeting riding a real live horse.

At the 1960 Provincial convention in Edmonton, the Alberta Jaycees awarded me the Wally Rowan Memorial Senatorship. Doing the honors was outgoing Alberta President Reg Clark 1585.

In 1961, I called the first meeting of Alberta Senators at the Medicine Hat Convention. Not long after I invited all Edmonton Senators to form a local club. It carried on for many years. All my files are in a binder I gave to our National Archives (Bill Diamond 57690).

I was honored to be invited by Pete Kennedy 7876 and Bill Skribe 25511 to let my name stand for election as VP in 2001. Sorry I had to decline as Nancy was ill and died of cancer in March 2003.

I have attended and enjoyed the fellowship at Crew Meetings in Windsor, ON, Winnipeg, MB. New Westminster, BC, Calgary, AB and looking forward to Victoria 2011.

Rotary International has been a rewarding experience, having joined Edmonton West in 1963, then over to Edmonton South in 1965. A few years ago the club presented me the Paul Harris Fellowship award. About ten years ago we were invited to work as hosts at the Calgary Annual Convention. 25,000 members attended and what a great event it was. Edmonton South currently has two Senators beside me on the roster in Gordon Hill 7150 and Ivan Radostits 10380.

Cec Purves 5324 organized meetings of local Senators for a few years. Now I challenge Graham, Pat, Bruce, George, Neil, Ivan, Bud and Don to have at least one meeting a year.

Thank you to Barney and Molly for their untiring efforts to keep our Senate family informed and in touch.
