The highlight of the past month has to be the fantastic JCI Canada National Convention in Edmonton. Roland Kwemain, JCI World President from the Congo was in attendance along with International Vice President Lenny Garvizu from Bolivia. The quality of speakers peaked with a teleconference presentation by Dr. Stephen Covey, the very popular author of "The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People". The Awards Ceremony included the presentation of the Phil Pugsley Memorial Award as outstanding Senator in Canada to Senator Wilf Mulder 67510 of Vernon, BC. A large number of Senators and Maple Leafs would not like to see “The Road We Travel” end as we know that each and everyone of you have a very interesting story to tell.

Any member or associate member who would like to send in a story (true or funny) that actually happened between the times you joined the Jaycee/Jaycette organizations and now may do so. These stories, if you wish should include the names of others who participated in the event as submitted by Senator Angevine below.

Senator John S Angevine 18692

As some of you know, Senator Douglas A Hammar 9700 has for many years conducted overseas holiday tours with friends and acquaintances. Recently Senators Don Lawson 2468, Russ Cooper 4638 and I joined him and Donna with our spouses on a trip to Germany.

One of the early highlights was a couple of dinners with Friedhelm Wachs, President of the German Senate and voted International Senator of the Year. His wife Micha also joined us for the second dinner. He talked about the European Senates. How businesses are often required by legislation to join the Chamber of Commerce, how Jaycees are closely linked with the Chamber of Commerce and that many Jaycee units have waiting lists to join!

When Communists confiscated most of the property in East Germany after WW II, much of the businesses fled to West Germany. Much of the eventual resistance to the Communist State in East German originally evolved through the churches because they were one of the few places people could speak out about the oppression. Restitution applications to recover property were quite a challenge. Most East German farms were never recovered and it all reminded us of the democratic freedoms and human rights we sometimes take for granted.

We visited Bonn, Largely rebuilt from WW II bombing with striking modern buildings. It was the West German capital for years before they moved much of it to Berlin. Some Government Departments, UN and other agencies still use most of the buildings today. Bonn was also the home of Beethoven and we saw some original manuscripts of his compositions.

In a visit to nearby Cologne, rebuilt from virtual destruction, we saw one of the biggest Cathedrals in the world which partly survived the bombing and was amazingly rebuilt to its original state.

We “soaked up” some rich European culture with a couple of concerts in Leipzig, home to Bach, Mendelsson, Wagner and Schumann. We attended a performance of La Traviata and another with the Berlin Philharmonic.

The reconstruction of other cities like Berlin and Dresden that were virtually wiped out was astounding. Many historic ornate buildings were completely rebuilt and restored providing quite a contrast with some stunning modern architectural design in many new buildings. Much of Berlin looks like a new city.

In Potsdam, near Berlin, we toured the site and main building used for the historic conference of Allied leaders in 1945. All in all...it was quite a ride!
