In 2010 we lost distinguished Senator William (Bill) JA Rowe 3475 who died instantly by stroke. Bill and I traveled together for many years. He was National President and I as National Vice President. We attended World Congress in Oklahoma and Kyoto plus Economic Forum in Belfast and many other conventions together.

We earned MBA's at Simon Fraser University. Our paths crossed many times across Canada and we were ardent fishing buddies along with our families.

Bill continued strong ties with our Alumnus and the following account illustrates how his Jaycee experience made a valuable contribution to SFU.

William Rowe, EMBA '72 - By Derek Moscato

SFU Business has established a new Executive MBA (EMBA) alumni professorship in honor of the late William Rowe.

Rowe, who worked for nearly 40 years at Air Canada, including on its senior leadership team, died earlier this year. He earned an EMBA from SFU in 1972 and established a long-lasting relationship with both the university and SFU Business.

Rowe's is the second EMBA alumni professorship created at SFU Business. The other is named after the late Dennis Culver, who was also an SFU EMBA alumnus.

In the spirit of the individuals for whom they are named, the EMBA professorships recognize professional excellence", says SFU Business Dean Daniel Shapiro. "The faculty members chosen for this honor are accomplished scholars and teachers".

A Longtime advocate of business education, Rowe received a 1995 Chancellor's Distinguished Service award, a 1996 Outstanding Alumni award and a 1996 EMBA Distinguished Service award for his enormous contributions and service to the university.

He held alumni order-in-council position on the university's Board of Governors FROM 1999-2005. He served for two years as the Deputy Board Chair and seven years as Chair of the 26-member External advisory Board for the Faculty of Business Administration.

He also chaired SFU's finance and administration committee, and sat on the audit, nominating and governance committees.

In 2000, Rowe chaired the search committee for a new university President. He also played a valuable leadership role in Bridge to the Future, the university's first major fundraising campaign.
