Tell us how you got involved in the JCI organization, the community you live in and what inspired you to become active in this great organization. In January of 1974 a friend was telling me about a new organization she had joined. All she could talk about was the fun she was having and all the great people she was meeting. After several weeks of hearing the stores, I finally asked if anyone could join. That was the beginning.

A week or so later I attended my first meeting and before it was half over I knew I had to be a part of this crazy bunch. That was the path, which lead me to the North Calgary Jaycees.

In truth my reasons for joining were to get out of the rut I was in. I knew that I was in a dead end job and was going nowhere fast, but I just did not know how to change things.

My employer thought I was smart enough to take under his wing and he gave me more responsibility. But I was working in the oil and gas industry and for a woman in the early 70's without a degree in geophysics I was not going to get far or that was what I believed.

I had the unique opportunity to join when the organization had no women. North Calgary was the first mixed unit in Canada which meant that the majority of Jaycees that I came in contact with were men who had come to the organization for all the right reasons. I must give credit to the guys from the Calgary unit because they set an example that made me push myself and I am very grateful for that. I am grateful for their skepticism tolerance of all of the women in my unit. I know that may sound strange, but their skepticism made me work even harder to prove that I did deserve to be there. They were a force to be reckoned with and I am proud to count many of them as good friends. I like to believe that in time they came to respect me as much as I did them,

The day I joined the course of my life changed and before long my employers and coworkers began to recognize changes in my abilities, confidence and ambition. Those changes resulted in my being offered opportunities that would ultimately change my future. In a very short space of time I found myself doing things I had never realized I was capable of. Oh don't misunderstand, I did not set out to learn anything when I joined, but in that truly unique environment where we made sure everything meant having a good time I learned in spite of myself. Very soon my reasons for staying were very different from my reasons for joining.

Beyond all the things that I learned, I believe that the single thing that made the Jaycee organization as it was then different from any other organization that existed at the time or since was the fellowship. The spirit of the organization came alive in all of us and changed our way of looking at people and things which made everyone see us differently as well. We were in every sense of the word a family and we still are. Many of the people I feel closest to are those that shared that experience with me. What comes from that incredibly intense feeling of belonging is the confidence, desire and drive to challenge you by creating the "I can do that" attitude. That feeling is still with me today and I will be forever grateful to the organization and its members for changing my life forever.

I believe that the greatest gift we can give back as Senators is the fostering and nurturing of that unique "Jaycee" spirit that comes not from what the organization is called or what they do, but from the heart of each member. It's that spirit that I believe has been lost along the way.
