At the fabulous Crew Meeting in Victoria I told Barney I would tell my story for what it is worth.

It seems so long ago and it is--- I was introduced to Jaycees in 1966 in Whitehorse, Yukon Territory around June 22nd. I remember it as I arrived from Ottawa by bus on Sunday the 21st. I was a young lad of 20 and had been invited by my best friend Dave Steele to come to the Yukon for a job as it was not going well in School and we agreed to Part Company. I was somewhat of a loner, shy and had always kept to myself. Dave said we are going TO a CLUB - YA right I thought - I couldn't even talk to a person one on one! Well my name was put forward to join the Jaycees - it was approved and here is where it started. I had no choice back then I had to take effective speaking, be involved in the community projects and learn life giving tools that no school could ever teach me. I knew nothing and had no idea of where I was going working as a shipping clerk in the local grocery store.

I was growing and had no idea I was. I met fabulous people -- In the early years I was having fun doing community projects like the water conservation program for the town of 3000 people and creating slogans like "save water, shower with a friend"! I had no friend at that time!!! We were a strong active organization that had a reputation of - if you want it done call the Jaycees. I started to live, eat and breathe Jaycees. I moved up through the ranks and became President. I was gaining confidence in myself - still didn't know what I wanted to do and was now the assistant grocery manager and Dave was my boss. Our friendship was faltering and I needed a change in career at age 24. Along comes Ron Weisner - another Jaycee who worked for the TD bank. Right - me a banker!

We were involve with politics and had regular meetings with the Mayor and Council and even presented them with a framed copy of the Bill of Rights that still hangs in the foyer of the city hall. I saw the bank as a way out of the territory at someone else's expense! It worked!!! We attended lots of conventions and were in great friendship and rivalry with Prince George. Even hitchhiked to Nanaimo for one - we always won the trophy for farthest traveler!! I started to meet wonderful people and was now married in 69 and had a son in 70. The Jaycettes were strong also. I was learning to lead. I still did not really comprehend what our Creed really meant. I believe we started the North Delta Jaycees after my transfer and that was with the help of shakers and mover like Senators Ralph Williams 17758, Norman Ketcheson 31503 and maybe Rene Jacob 22847 somewhere around 73. Then it was back to Whitehorse in 74. What a crazy life I was leading. In 76 I was out again but with Senator NUMBER 19392, now that was emotional - now I was having friends like David Trace 27821 and Maurice Magowan 27537, Blair Fraser 36339 and Rene, Rick Morrow 22389, Alf Dunn 8567, Bert Woodcock 27640, Crazy Hanz Langer, Bert Kennedy 5922 and a whole bunch more. In 79 I became National Vice President for BC and the Yukon. We had a great team and nationally were led by David Robart-Morgan 27291 - remember "you done well".

I seemed to have a passion then and Jaycees were my family, as I was now a single parent. I thought I knew what I wanted. So I quit the bank and applied for the Canada Jaycee National Executive Director position in 1980. Got it and moved to Ottawa. Now that was a year in the life of John. Well that didn't work out and back to banking in Alberta. I lost interest in Jaycees and was bitter at that time. Had many Jaycee friends that continued to support me and I will never forget their faithfulness to me with the love and caring during a troubled time.

I became a Christian at that time and now started to understand "faith in God giving meaning and purpose to human life" As I changed careers in 1988 to Community Futures and still continue to work for them. I now look back and see how I was molded to do what I am doing today. Human personality Service to humanity and the rest of the Creed, I now get paid very well to do what Jaycees taught me through those 20 years. I now can speak to large audiences, Premiers, large city Councils and conferences. I have been the President of Saskatchewan Economic Development Association and sat on the Board of Directors for the Economic Development Association for Canada. I do lots of community work and have been blessed with a ministry of encouragement. "Thought for the week" goes out to a large audience, even some of you. It has a word of encouragement and a scripture tied to it. I am humbled.

In closing - I would not be where I am today without Jaycees giving me the tools to do what I do. There are so many of you and your families that as Rene said to me in Walking the Plank - "there are many of us that care for you John". I am touched. If you are not mentioned here it is only because you are loved in the family and the list is very long.

May we never change our Creed to be politically correct? We were started as a Christian organization in a Christian country. Join us as you so wish but remember:-

WE BELIEVE THAT FAITH IN **GOD** GIVES MEANING AND PURPOSE TO HUMAN LIFE - PERIOD!!!!!!!!!!!!!! - And all the rest of the Creed.
