I have enjoyed reading "The Road We Travel" over the past few years, but I can't help marveling at how many Jaycees retired to wealthy lives. I wish I could say the same, but I can't, but I have retired to Florida with a modest pension plus a great deal of happiness and fine memories.

I was inducted into Jaycees I believe in 1972 by Peter Tiveron 18005, joining the Bramalea Jaycees. This was shortly after their charter and I remember names like Larry Bryan 22232, Gary McWilliams, Leo Van Kralingen, George Duquette 25848, Ron Hart 36439, Stan Sylvester, Syd Harmon 17443 and many others whose name, but not their faces which elude this retiree.

The first project I was founding chair for was the "Jaycee Bursary" a project aimed at supporting one graduating high school student from Bramalea with adequate marks, but not brilliant. After I left Bramalea the remaining Jaycees added substantial funding to support two students and I believe today even with the surrender of the charter a group of former Jaycees is still awarding the support annually to two students.

I was fortunate in serving as Secretary and President of Bramalea. At the end of my year as President I filed to run as Regional Director. I received a phone call from Lloyd Stockdale 20377 who said he never thought of me as such. I served for him receiving outstanding Regional Director and we have been close friends ever since, indeed he served as my best man twice what a feat of perseverance.

Following my year as Regional Director, I ran for National Vice President with Gordon Newman 27357 and Neville Claire 19719, needless to say we got slaughtered by Neville. I also served as Extension Chairman for Central Region successfully founding a unit in Newmarket. I was successful along the way in winning the Regional Effective Speaking, but got knocked off in the National competition in Toronto.

At this point my career as sales engineer took a massive turn. My firm transferred me to Sherbrooke, Quebec where I served as Plant Superintendent.

Next I moved onto Thetford Mines and managed Metallurgie Frontenac Ltee out of bankruptcy. What a unique opportunity the plant was owned one-third by employees, one-third by local merchants and one-third by the Quebec government, how

beautiful when the Quebec Minister of Industry entered my office and I addressed him in French and he replied in flawless English. I reported directly to the Board and it wasn't so great having my Purchasing Agent as Vice President of same. Then it was back to Ontario where I started being hired to do turnarounds for factories that were going bankrupt. I worked with Rantex Brush in Barrie, Leon -Ram in Yorkton SK, Uniforge in Nisku, AB, and Polyurethane Sheeting in Truro, NS. I also started a manufacturer's rep in Dundas ON for Altex an offshoot of Alcan who extruded aluminum. We covered everything west of Quebec.

At the ripe old age of 61 my wife got me into retail and we opened a wine making store in Dundas, ON and then moved out west and opened another in Kelowna, BC.

Along the way my Jaycee training successfully stood me in good stead as I took on many volunteer and professional groups, Director Prairie Implement Manufacturers Association, Trustee Peel Board of Education, Chairman Trainable Mentally Retarded, Chairman French Language Advisory Committee, Director Peel Family Services, Director Dundas Rotary, President Westbank Rotary, President Gellatly Nut Farm, President Westbank & District Chamber of Commerce, Director South Okanagan Economic Development Committee, Director Rygiel Homes, Director Steel Casting Institute of Canada, Coach Chinguacousy Girls Softball, to name a few that I remember.

On a personal note I was married to Gaynoll for 23 years, we have three beautiful children and she became a Jaycette, I was married to Barbara for three years and now to my third beautiful wife Irene celebrating our 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary as I write this, to me. We had seven grandchildren but two died and we have two great grandchildren.

We have adapted the snowbird life, living 6 months in Florida, 2 in Kelowna, BC, 2 in Edmonton, AB and two in Newmarket, ON. Living two months of the year with our children might be called getting even. Thanks for the memories.
