Senator William E (Ted) Campbell 10479 & Ann

In 1963 we were in Calgary running a 7 truck over-the-road outfit hauling hanging beef from Calgary and Red Deer to Vancouver via Idaho and Washington - the Rogers Pass was under construction 'til the fall of '62. When it opened two things occurred. First we went from a "team" operation to single drivers on each rig. Next Burns Meats announced their new (lower) rate structure. We struggled 'til the spring of '63 when we were invited back to Kitimat to a wedding. We were on the dance floor of the reception; Ann was waltzing with her old boss. After the music ended we chatted for a few moments. Bob asked. "Have you ever thought about returning to Kitimat?" Without missing a beat I said. "If Ann had her job back we'd never leave." He said. "Report for work Monday morning" She burst into tears.

I returned to Calgary, sold everything except one tractor, finally took a Mercury sedan and cash in trade for it, welded up a tow-bar, loaded clothes and bed linens in both cars, called the furniture guys and headed west. When our furniture arrived the fridge wasn't working so I took it to Hilite Electric across the street from the Kitimat Gordon Hotel. Lloyd Hubbard who owned Hilite said he'd have it ready noon Thursday. It wasn't ready and I was getting upset so he said. "I'll have it ready first thing tomorrow morning, to make up for it. I'll take you to dinner tonight to a guy's club." Guys club sounded like - a small-town version of Playboy so I said sure.

It was a Jaycee meeting, I'd been in business since I bought my first truck when I was 19, I could buy, sell, hire, fire and make deals, but for the life of me I couldn't stand up and say my own name. Many were Engineers with Alcan or Bank Accountants; I was driving a molten metal truck and felt way out of my league. After the meeting Lloyd said "I couldn't introduce myself when I first joined either, now you can't shut me up. He asked me to come with him to the next meeting - I didn't miss a Jaycee meeting for at least 10 years.

By late fall Alcan asked if I was interested in becoming an equipment trainer, they sent me to a short course at UBC, and then I helped design a training format. By the fall of '64 we had an excellent equipment operator training program in place, costs went down, safety went up and everyone was happy.

Kitimat and Jaycees were a perfect complement, a brand new community needing civic awareness and young men looking for an outlet to develop their talents.

In '65 Kitimat was still the only strong Unit in the Northwest with a fledgling start up not doing well in Terrace. Pressure was put on both Units by the Provincial Executive to have someone attend the Provincial Convention in Trail. Dave Hjerpe from Terrace said he could use his GMAC company car, Alcan gave me time off with pay and the Province paid our hotel room and waived registration. In those days it was a tough 18 hour drive over narrow muddy roads.

By this time I was comfortable with the Kitimat members but Trail was a new game, many attendees knew others either from within their own District or previous Conventions, Dave had been with the Richmond Unit, he gravitated to old pals and I sat alone Thursday and most of Friday when I decided "enough is enough" I'll catch a bus home.

Friday there was a General Assembly with both Jaycees and Jaycettes attending. I put up my hand; Alf Dunn was in the chair. "Mr. Chairman my name is Ted Campbell and I'm from the Kitimat Unit. I have something to say. After that I have something else members of my Unit asked me to relay to you." I heard whispers all around.

I began walking slowly around the room, speaking softly, pausing at the end of each sentence. "Attending this Convention was supposed to be a way of strengthening the Jaycee movement in the North." I made sure people turned to look, and then I moved again, lowered my voice and continued to speak. "My friend from Terrace and I left in the dark of Wednesday night, drove all day and arrived late that evening at the express invitation of the Provincial Executive. Not one person has welcomed me, when I try to join a group or even sit at a table I am ignored. Newcomers are not made welcome." I shook my head. "You really don't want to hear what my report is going to recommend."

When I stopped you could have heard a pin drop. I gave Alf credit for trying to pick up the ball. "We are very sorry for the way you feel." I noticed a lady bristle. She was upset. I soon learned this was Mayli Dunn. "You said you had a message from your Unit?"

"I do. Kitimat is a brand-new city carved out of the wilderness in the last 10 years. Our membership is teachers, engineers, bank accountants and business owners. Many were single young men who are now meeting and marrying progressive young ladies. And we're having a great time together. There are a lot of single girls envious of their pals who are Jaycettes and would like to join but the rules say only the wife of a Jaycee may become a Jaycette. None of the Jaycettes agree with that and neither do their friends. They've asked me to ask this body to allow other than wives of Jaycees join Jaycettes." I sat down.

This was Mayli's opportunity. She really tore a strip off me. "How dare you come down here without your wife, telling the Jaycettes how to run their organization?" Most girls were intimidated by her, heads bobbed and I became even more of a pariah. Alf and the others did their best to smooth things over, a rift lasted the rest of the Convention but they didn't soon forget Kitimat.

The Kitimat Unit continued growing, I became the Secretary, and Bruce Isbell a Jaycee from Ontario joined which added real strength. Bruce is a talented, easy-going organizer, always nearby with a good idea that people accept without resenting his input. Kitimat was stronger; Terrace not so much and nothing in Prince Rupert or Smithers. At a joint meeting in Prince George I met Alf again. He called me aside. "I heard you're with Alcan's training department?" "I am." "I've applied for a position with Alcan as Staff Trainer."

I knew I was a good equipment trainer but motivating Supervisors and Management was beyond my talents. Alf and I had a heart to heart chat; I put in a good word with the Personnel Manager when I returned. A short time later Alf called, he was coming to Kitimat for his final meeting, Ann and I had him as a dinner guest. When he and Mayli and the kids arrived, we invited them for their first dinner in Kitimat and we became life-long friends. I really miss Alf.

Ann joined Jaycettes when I joined Jaycees, the next year she was on their Executive, a year later President of North Coast Skeena Jaycettes. My wife is and always has been a force to be reckoned with in her own merit. At the Provincial Convention in Nanaimo she was elected Provincial President and did a spectacular job.

The Jaycees in the North were fortunate having a strong group in Kitimat, we designed what we nick-named the 3-P program aimed at starting new units. The cards were named Past, Present and Future. We made 3 hand-held cards. The first told how Jaycees got started and its progress 'til the present. Card 2 explained the local, Provincial, Canadian and International levels. Card 3 was how we envisioned a new unit should form in whatever community we were vesting. We asked local Chambers of Commerce to rent a hall and invite young men to a meeting, our Jaycettes made a portable meal, and we took the Kitimat "Bar in a Box" along. We found a local person willing to take one of the cards and we took the others. Prince Rupert was our first target community and a new Unit was formed before we left town. That set the members from Terrace on fire, we ran a similar program, Lee Dennill took one of the cards; became the new Unit President and his wife Wendy was the Jaycette President. I'm sure Lee is Terrace's first Senator. When we went to Smithers it felt like a rally, we had members from Kitimat, Prince Rupert and Terrace with us. North Coast Skeena really came alive.

Prince George asked us to put on a presentation, but distance was an issue. It was an 8 hour drive over mostly gravel roads, a few less-than-creative people at Alcan were beginning to wonder about all our time off. Looking back Alcan did very well by the Jaycees, Alf and I honed our skills and became proficient on the job. Other members working at the plant stood out among their peers.

Our District created a package we sent to all other Districts but it took more than 3 little cards to make the expansion project come alive.

Then the Kitimat Jaycees found themselves in a dilemma. Bruce became ICBC's computer manager, Alf was headhunted by Weyerhaeuser, I joined Sun Life, Lloyd Hubbard's electrical business really took off, Ray Brady became an Alderman, Wayne Braid and Ron Freed moved to Terrace; suddenly the new members found themselves running an organization within a community that had huge expectations of them. In less than a year they all quit leaving the Unit deep in the red.

Ray Brady and Wolf Schultz asked if I'd meet them and Lloyd at the hotel. Six of us were all that was left squeezed into a narrow booth. We agreed to run a "once-time-only" project to pay off the debt then wind it down. Ray and Lloyd went to Al Kubas the local Ford dealer who had been a Jaycee. Al gave us a brand-new T-Bird at cost and picked up the shipping.

We ran a reverse draw T-Bird club, 100 members @ \$100.00 each; the "President" was given a new T-Bird. We went to 10 local merchants and got donations of top-quality prizes like watches, fishing reels, rods and jackets. On draw night we rented the Rod and Gun Club, had a blast, gave away a new car and paid the bills. In the interim the Unit acquired several new members and the Kitimat Jaycees survived another day.

Looking back on the basic premise of Jaycees it was a win-win situation, we ran the annual July 1st parade, decorated the top of the shopping mall every Christmas, one year we even cut, painted and sprinkled glitter on 4' plywood signs then lit them with timed lighting courtesy of Hilite Electric.

The Kitimat Jaycees were a credit to the community. On the other hand many of our members also did well. Bruce Isbell stepped on then off several software bubbles at exactly the right times. Fred Durdan transferred with Alcan to Riverside Ca. in Senior Management. Bill Rich was an Alcan Vice President, Ed Lawry became President of Harrisburg Brass, Alf Dunn developed a Management Training program for Weyerhaeuser, Ray Brady was Kitimat Mayor several times and Wayne Braid became President of the BC Notaries Public. Jaycees were good for all.

Ann and I have had an amazing life; she is the perfect mate for me. "Carpe diem" fits us to a tee. We had the whirlwind romance many dream about except ours is like the Energizer bunny, it just keeps going and going. We've owned a logging company, did a 64 lot land development in Kitimat, and ran charter boats in what is now called the Great Bear Rain Forest. Our latest venture was Pure Water Transport, 6 stainless steel tankers, a 9 rig in-town trailer service delivering bottles to soft drink plants and a 12 tractor over-the-road division carrying Rogers Sugar east and Safeway home. During this time Ann became a Marriage Commissioner; 4,000 weddings over 15 years, I make a point of being with her Saturdays and we go for dinner after the last wedding. I often tell people I was looking to get lucky the day I met her and it was the luckiest day of my life.

We moved recently as Ann had a heart attack - 4 stents later we decided it was time to get closer to our family, we now share a home with our daughter and her two growing sons 14 and 15 which are working well for everyone. If there is a good news side to her heart attack it is the realization that a pack-a-day smoker for 50 years finally got the message. Cigarettes kill. Ann is living proof how extremely addictive tobacco really is. She's been off the weed about a month but is still going through withdrawal and it is almost as painful for me as for her.
