I want to apologize for not getting right back to you. I am still working and had to wait for the world to slow down.

My initial experience with Jaycees was interesting and extremely formative. Though you and I Barney go way back to Upstate New York and the Amerada experience in the 60's and 70's, I was introduced to Jaycees by my brother-in-law in Connecticut while I was going to University of Connecticut. He was married to my oldest sister and knew I was trying to learn about life and enjoyment. One weekend he offered to take me to a Jaycee Convention in Hartford, Connecticut, and he mentioned free beer so I was ready. I was taken to the Nation Convention for the award of Outstanding Young Men and as I stood in the wings having met each of the fellows and of course drinking beer. I was totally impressed. How did these men achieve so much in so short a time? When I spoke to a fellow with the strangest Massachusetts accent by the name of Kennedy, John F., I knew I was among some very special people. To say I was impressed would be an understatement.

I did not join the young man's organization at that time and had to wait about another 6/7 years when I was searching for the developmental help/direction that the Jaycees offered, but that O.Y.M. program never left me. I did not vote for that special American, but was assured that our nation would be in good hands. I was awed by Arthur Ashe and sadden when he died. Those are the only two men that I remember back those 50 plus years ago. The program was dynamic and inspiring as are the Jaycees still today. The opportunities now are wider and more diverse yet the potential for any individual, male or female who wishes to exceed are still there. In the early 70's, the State of New York Jaycees honored me for my work and my chapter's work in the State correctional Institution in our home town. My brother-in-law was no longer with us then, yet in my mind he was standing there as he did for so long a time before, encouraging me to continue.

I am working in Edgerton, Kansas as Construction Manager of a \$100 million project for the BNSF Railroad. Rosemary and I came here three years ago to start the project but the economic downturn derail (pun intended) it for two year. We left Kansas and then spent 99 days traveling across the Gulf and up the East Coast, visiting friends and family and returned to New Orleans. We are still living together - part of the time - so I guess we will stay together for another 53 years. It was a great trip and we took it in the motor I bought to have a place to live while we fix our house after Katrina I have used for a project in Oklahoma and then back here in Kansas, although I have upgraded to a newer model. We expect to finish up here next year and I would like to head west in the RV, with Vancouver in our sights. Things are good and it is great to have a client like BNSF, especially when they demand you do their work. I would say this is the last one, but I don't want to commit yet. At 72, married to an older woman, you never know what your schedule will be. Right now things are exceptional.

Our boys too have become successful. Our oldest Lee is Curator of Birds at the Audubon Zoo in New Orleans and AZA Administration for the repopulation of Guam and Tinein – two Pacific islands we screwed up when we brought equipment back from Viet Nam. We let the Brown Snake loose in an environment with no predators. After all the birds and animals were eaten, they died too and now he and 9 others are bringing the native species back. It's very interesting and he is very proud. (Tinein - spelling questionable - was the island that the planes took off from to carry the atomic bomb to Japan). He is not married and does considerable world traveling.

Our youngest is an EE in Tampa, Florida. He left high school and went into the service (Navy) and realized repairing jet engines were not what he wanted. In 8 years, he was able to graduate University of Maryland and leave the service with a degree, a wife and two children. Their eldest, a daughter is graduating this year from Central Florida University with a BS in Journalism. I do wonder if there are any jobs out though. I suggested we (I am vicariously backed at the University by paying for it) get our Masters because of the economic conditions. Their younger a Black Belt computer nerd son is a senior in high school, looking for meaning and truth - I guess I know what I was looking for at 17. They are wonderful kids, living in a great place and expecting nothing but the best. Hal - the youngest works throughout Florida, the Caribbean and parts of Central America. I think those trips to Ottawa wetted their appetite for travel.

Rosemary has become a child advocate for the Courts - it's called Casa Worker. She has just finished up a case she had been working on for a couple of years. You definitely have to be someone special to be able to deal with the families whose lives are wrecks. She also volunteers at the Audubon Zoo, of course in the bird department - when she is not coming to Edgerton (suburb of Kansas City) for two weeks a month. She does not like Kansas at all after living here for a year - too windy and it's either too cold (-19 degrees this past winter) or too hot (+112 last month) - that's Fahrenheit. I am not working this February so we are either going to Santo Domingo or Panama City, Panama for the month. We expect to be shut down on the project and I have some top shelf people working for me who will remain available.

I have a hard time thinking that we have not been to Canada in over 45 to 50 years and not seen any of our friends from there. I really appreciate your Newsletters and recognize a name or two every once in a while.

Many times it's with sadness for some who passes. I will offer to you, to visit us in New Orleans at your convenience. It is an unbelievable place. If we had this place to go to in the 60's, I don't think we would have left then. We do have season tickets (4) to the Saints at the Superdome, and Rosemary bleeds black and gold. A long weekend is possible, especially when things start turning deep white at Vancouver, they will still be comfortable in The Big Easy. I sincerely plan on that trip after this project through Yellowstone, Glacier and to Washington, so don't be surprised when we appear. Until then, y'all take care and remember we are out here and thinking about you.

I hope this is the type of incident you are interested in and I very much enjoy receiving The Canada JCI Senate Newsletter. The older people we were around are thinning out rapidly now, but the exciting excursions between Upstate New York and Canada are unforgettable memories for myself, my wife Rosemary and our two boys. We love you all and miss you, the spirit and comradely. CHIMO!

For those of you that are not in the local community you may not be aware that Senator Donald W Sloman 40508 passed away at home Sunday, March 4. He died of a stroke.

Don was truly a great example of a volunteer, an excellent Senator and above all a friend to each and every one of us. I cannot think of a person who gave more of himself without receiving the proper recognition. Despite his back injuries he would lend a hand whenever asked. His memory of dates, names and events was incredible. He knew the dates of anniversaries and the birthday of most of all our children, he could tell you your mother and father's name and how old they were as well. Don didn't need minutes of meetings as he could tell you who was at what meeting when it was held and where even from years past.

Don went to more World Congress meetings than most and attended many more of JCI Canada National Conventions and zone meetings than he needed to be. He loved being with a crowd, and he knew most of the people there by the time he left.

Don was a quiet and gentle person despite his dominant size. Don knew more about everyone in all of the communities that he took part in. One time he and Tim were walking down a street in Banff and he recognized someone from Oshawa, went over hailed them and spoke to them, not a close acquaintance either but then he never needed an excuse to be cordial.

If you ever had the pleasure of travelling with Don you would have found him to be congenial and polite with some small degree of refinement needed. He loved to eat. People were amazed to this day as to how Don could put away a piece of pie. Years of bachelorhood had their way of showing. He invested diversely and well when he had an income that allowed it and had a onetime strong portfolio although somewhat less now than what it used to be when the TSE was doing well. Don was smarter than what he let on.

I think he was comfortable with his life and enjoyed it as he was very active with lots of clubs and activities. Don was a constant fan of public speaking and was more than willing to speak up at Senate meetings. Don loved a good joke and humour was always well received as he had the loudest laugh in the room. He was a real part of the fabric of the Durham Senate and the Oshawa Jaycees when he was younger.

Don had a knack of falling asleep often in a crowd, sometimes even when he was driving as experienced one night coming back from visiting the Warkworth Chapter he was the driver on the 401 at the time! We will really miss him. May he rest in peace; he deserves it, even if it was too soon.
