A Special Person, a Special Senator.....His Legacy in Jaycees

Recently a quote was read to a large gathering at a memorial service in Oshawa Ontario that went something to the effect:

**"It isn't important that you remember what you did for someone else
but it is very important that you remember what someone has done for you"**

These words came from some writings by JCI Senator Donald Sloman 40580 as he completed an assignment in his quest for a high school diploma at a very late stage in his life. Many in the room on March 24th heard the words as they were lovingly delivered by Don's sister. To me, and I'm sure others it spoke of how Don Sloman lived his life and recently how this transformed to his legacy. I met Don as he began his Jaycee career in 1975 at the Barrie Ontario Jaycees Convention entitled "Heart of Gold Convention", how significant this title has become. Don was a gracious, kind and caring man who had a far better memory than most, a love of history and of meeting people with a passion for self-improvement and helping others in a variety of "communities". Through Jaycees, Don rose to every available opportunity in personal development, community programs, he travelled to regional, national and international events, always learning, always enjoying the friendships of many and making new acquaintances. Don Sloman was deeply appreciative of the honour and recognition he often received in Jaycees. Receiving his JCI Senatorship was the pinnacle of his Jaycee career not because of what he had done but more that he could continue to share, learn, help out and embrace his friendships throughout the world.

True to his high school writing quoted above and with the irony of first meeting Don at the "Heart of Gold" convention, Donald Sloman remembered what Jaycees had done for him. In his will Don remembered the Canada Jaycee Foundation with a very kind and generous gift of \$25,000. Living life with the principle "that you remember what someone has done for you" is Donald Sloman's legacy in Jaycees. Our job will be to remember this giant of a Jaycee with a heart of gold and the lesson he has given us.

Thank you Donald Sloman, JCI Senator 40580 for this lasting and generous gift, the superb example of leadership in living your life by principle and for your friendship to many in Jaycees for 37 years. You truly did remember what was important to you and you gave a wonderful reminder to Jaycees and Senators throughout the world to remember to say thank you.

Senator Donald B Poore 2748

My Jaycee "Road" began when I was 25 and had just moved to Kingsville, Ontario (the most southerly town in Canada) with my new bride Edie in September 1953.

Soon after, a guy who lived across the street invited me out to dinner to meet "some people I would want to know". It turned out he was right. I did want to know them and he was President of the Kingsville Jaycees. I was impressed with the aims "training for leadership" and the Jaycee Creed so I joined that night.

I worked hard and learned a lot. One year I was Chairman of ten committees. I learned how to work with volunteers, keep a meeting on track, speak effectively, proper meeting procedure, etc. Two years later I was elected Vice President and the next year President.

In 1960 I was elected President of District One of the Ontario Jaycees. District one comprised all the Jaycee units in Essex, Kent and Lambton counties. Chatham and Windsor were very strong and well organized. I learned a lot more from them than they learned from me. I tried to pass good ideas and methods along in my two visits a year and at our District conferences. About a year after my term as District President, I was persuaded by a number of Jaycees around the District to let my name stand again and I was again elected. This worked very well because I didn't have to learn the job and I knew most of the people. I learned at the Ontario Board Meetings in Hamilton a lot about what was happening outside District One and more good ideas to share and holes to avoid. Models I tried to follow were Murray Girt 1757 and Arthur Murcott 2495.

We in Kingsville had a number of politicians and Public Servants as Speakers. They are often quite willing and I gained an interest in Municipal Government. I sought appointment to Kingsville – Gosfield – South (now combined). *I jointed the Joint Planning Board and Committee of Adjustment. I was Chairman for a number of public hearings. At one point all three town Councillors were Jaycees and I served one term.

It seems hardly possible that 50 years have passed since I became a Senator. I was surprised and greatly honoured. The presentation was made at a District meeting in Windsor at the end of my second term as President.

On Labour Day in 1969, Edie and I and our six children moved to Sarnia where I was District Manager of an Insurance company. After a couple of very busy years learning and meeting lots of people I was appointed to the Sarnia Planning Board. I was Chairman of more than 100 hundred public hearings over ten years. On my fourth run I was finally elected to Sarnia City Council where I served for nine years.

From 1985 to 1996 I was elected (get this title) "Canadian Co-Chairman of the Bi-National Public Advisory Council for the St. Claire river Remedial Action Plan". It was a big committee with 26 Canadians and 26 Americans. A lot of progress was being made on the cleanup.

In September 2009 at the age of 80 I retired and six of our children live in Sarnia, one in Port Stanley and one in Vancouver.

Edie and I celebrated our 58 Wedding Anniversary in September 2011. We share a great hobby which is live theatre, whether it is back stage, on stage or audience. Just this time, I got a part in a new musical comedy where I played an old Town Councillor named "Alvyn Abbot". One line from my solo was "Always vote for Alvyn Abbot, always first name on the Ballot".

It has been a "Great Road" and I give the Jaycees a lot of credit for many of the choices I have made and thank you all!

Windsor Star published April 10, 1963 – Kingsville Jails Quintet

GUILTY – Five members of the Leamington Jaycees spent the night in the Kingsville jail because they failed to convince a larger percentage of the voters to cast ballots than did the Kingsville Junior Chamber of Commerce. Making the arrest in Leamington Police Chief Keith Girardin of Kingsville escorts two of the suspects, Bob Holding and Frank Gates, to the cruiser as Kingsville Jaycees A.L. Kennedy, look on.

Leamington Men Lose Election Showing Bet

KINGSVILLE – Five Leamington men spent the night in jail here in the aftermath of the federal election despite efforts by a Member of Parliament to free them.

When the final election results showed that 91.8 percent of Kingsville voters cast their ballots while only 83.8 percent of Leamington voters went to the polls, the Kingsville Jaycees laid charges against their Leamington counterparts.

The Kingsville Police Chief Keith Girardin accompanied by Jaycee President D.L. Kennedy made the arrest in Leamington at 8 p.m. Taken into custody were Leamington Jaycees Bob Holding, Frank Gates, Irv Bergman, Larry Gaboury and Ernie Sorrell. The charges were the results of a challenge issued to the Kingsville group by Leamington President Bob Holding stating the Leamington Jaycees could encourage a greater percentage of the voters to exercise their rights than could the Kingsville group. The losers were to spend the night in jail.

Gene Whelan re-elected M.P. for Essex South riding, appeared at Kingsville Jail to seek the release of the prisoners. After an urgent discussion with Police Chief Girardin, bail was refused.

April 25 is being designated as World Malaria Day. Sorry about the short notice on that date but read on you... may find this article still worth a minute and hopefully worth 10 bucks for the Bed Nets Campaign too!!

Long-Lasting Insecticide-Treated Bed Nets

Bed nets work by creating a protective barrier against deadly-malaria carrying mosquitoes that bite at night. A family of four can sleep under an insecticide-treated bed net, safe from malaria, for three years. The benefits of bed nets extend even further than protecting those sleeping underneath them. The insecticide woven into each net makes entire communities safer – killing and repelling mosquitoes so that they can't go on to bite others who may not be protected by a net. Bed nets can reduce malaria transmissions by 90 percent in areas with high coverage rates. Although \$10 for a bed net may not sound like much, the cost makes them out of reach for most people at risk of malaria, many of whom survive on less than \$1 a day. According to the 2011 World Malaria Report 96% of people with access to a bed net use it. Nets are a simple life-saving solution, but we need your help to provide them to those in need.
