I am having so much fun as the Canada JCI Senate President that I pretty much feel like Ebenezer Scrooge after his night with the ghosts of the past, present and future. I can be "simply giddy" at the fun I am having. The letters that arrive daily with contributions to the Senate and words of encouragement are a source of great joy. I am pleased by the level of commitment by Senators who have the financial ability to contribute. Please know that your contributions do provide the Senate with the ability to interact with the current Jaycees and to interact with our American cousins who are also great supporters and have a great heart for the Canada JCI Senate.

When I was at the US JCI Senate Annual meeting in Florida, there was a wonderful video shown about the US JCI Senate, it's activates and history. There was mention that some of the history between the US JCI Senate and JCI USA has been very strained at times. The narrator of the video was very candid and forthright with this history and I think it was a brave thing to discuss and a bold move to state. I believe the Senate's role when interacting with Jaycees is support and support only. I am adamant in my thinking that a Senator (especially over the age 40) should never have an opinion unless asked and only when asked. I am equally adamant that a Senator should only have supportive comments and never be involved with any internal politics of a Jaycee Unit or Chapter. As President, I think that the Canada JCI Senate never has positions on how current Jaycees are managing or conducting themselves. Again, if we cannot be supportive then I think we need to fade to black, we had our time.

I have been asking over the past two Newsletters about the possibility of bringing the Canada JCI Senate Crew Meeting and the JCI Canada National Convention together and see if any synergies are at play. I have had very little feedback on this by email but I did discuss this on several occasions with Senators in Kimberly at the JCI Canada National Convention. I have concluded that the Canada JCI Senate, moving forward should be prepared to change the Terms of Reference in order to allow some flexibility. To this end, I have spoken with our Legal Counsel Art Braid 6211 and we have put together amendments to our Terms of Reference which will start to address this flexibility. These amendments will be voted on in Prince George and are as follows:

Presently reads: 8 - 2: That the date of the event be such that there be no conflict with the US Meeting of the Crew or Mother's Day. Recommended dates be the second or third weekends in April or May.

To be amended to read: **8 - 2: That the date of the event be such that there be no conflict with the US Meeting of the Crew *or the US JCI Senate's National, Fall or Winter Board Meetings* or Mother's Day. Recommended dates may be the second or third weekends in April or May, *or at the time of the Annual General Meeting of JCI Canada if so desired.***

Presently reads: 8 – 4: That the Meeting of the Crew be held in Canada, alternating each year on the opposite sides of the Ontario/Manitoba border.

To be amended to read: **8 - 4: That the Meeting of the Crew be held in Canada, alternating each year on the opposite sides of the Ontario/Manitoba border, *except for those years in which no Senate Committee can be found to host the Crew Meeting in the desired part of Canada or a year in which the Meeting of the Crew is to be held at the same place as the JCI Canada Annual General Meeting.***

This will be sufficient notice for our annual meeting; however there may be other amendments to our Terms of Reference which may also be considered. Senators must be in attendance in Prince George to have their voice heard on this potential change. Art Braid has confirmed that there are no proxy provisions nor are there provisions for a mail in ballot. I feel at a cross roads on this issue, do I look back and stay with the status quo or do I look forward? All my Jaycee training has me doing the latter. The flexibly being sought here can only be decided by the Canada JCI Senate members, who according to the Terms of Reference are all Senators who received their Senatorships within Canada and in attendance at the Crew Meeting considering the changes.

## **Nets Save Lives**

Several anti-malarial pharmaceutical drugs are currently available to both treat and prevent malaria, but they are too expensive for developing nations and offer only temporary relief from an imminent danger.

Drugs are not only dangerous due to their temporary effects, but the World Health Organization has also reported that as many as 40 percent of anti-malarial drugs are counterfeit and offer no protection at all. Despite years of research, there is still no widely available vaccine that provides a high level of protection for a sustained period.

Rather than depend on expensive medication that may be fake, JCI and the United Nations focus on saving lives through the prevention of transmission.

Insecticide-treated nets combine prevention methods, both preventing transmission and killing the host mosquito, which also prevents transmission to others not covered by the nets. These nets are inexpensive to produce and infuse with insecticide and have been shown to reduce transmission by as much as 90 percent in areas with high coverage rates.

That means that if JCI and its partners in the global fight against malaria are able to provide mosquito nets for all affected areas, we could cut malaria cases from as many as 500 million to as few as 35 million while continuing to work towards total eradication.

Whether by hanging mosquito nets in a city center to attract attention, hosting fundraising events or speaking in schools, JCI members across the globe are committed to the fight against malaria. ” ([www.jcinothingbutnets.com](http://www.jcinothingbutnets.com) website)

This fact really struck me – all the Senators under 45 are attending the JCI National Convention and only Senators over 50 are attending the Crew Meeting. As an “in-between” (at 48 years old) I see this as a glorious opportunity to make the Canada JCI Senate whole again.

We must be realistic – if the young Senators have a choice of one convention to go to, they will go to the JCI Canada National Convention since many of them are still of JCI age. As they say, “If you can’t bring the mountain to Mohammed, we may have to bring Mohammed to the mountain”.

When I visit Senate organizations across Canada, I find a growing understanding that we need to try reunification, if at least for a few years.
