Speech given during Cap de la Madeleine Junior Chamber Banquet on October 24, 1959

Cap de la Madeleine is 100 km west of Quebec City

Mr. Chairman - Past Presidents - Distinguished guests - Ladies and Junior Chamber Friends

In 1949 when the plot of Lucien Levesque and Fernand Lanouette took me to the Presidency of the Local Chapter of Junior Chamber, I could hardly believe that a guy who has lived for only two years at Cap de la Madeleine could merit such an honor, and I have said it with no uncertain terms to the other member then.

Fortunately for Junior Chamber, we took good care of finding good Directors on my Board that made me look good, because they were not afraid by work. It was said that my year was a success: for my part I did my best, but I had not the feeling of being part of the Junior Chamber movement and their values, although I appreciated the teachings of the movement.

Ten years after this memorable event in my life, I'm still President of our Local Chapter of Junior Chamber here in Cap de la Madeleine. But I'm only the Honorary President ... for the greater good of the members! How am I still here after a four years retirement? Of all the thoughts I went through, I did not draw any definite conclusion. Maybe the actual Executive committee had a moment of mental illness!

Anyhow, for better or for worse, the Junior Chamber still believe in me. And again, I consider myself the luckiest Honorary President! Indeed, after only two contacts with members I remember myself as the fresh new President of 1949.

The dynamism of your President René Montreuil, the crazy enthusiasm of Simon Grenier, the brilliance, honesty and dedication Denis Guérin, this bread carrier and his unforgivable funny faces! The sincerity of Jeannot Guy and Denis Morin, old opponents in football and hockey! The prestige of Jacques Hébert and his impeccable words! The will to get to know all of our members at Junior Chamber.... it all fills me with admiration and pride!

Dear friends of Junior Chamber, if I agreed with your concern to be your Honorary President because of the unknown of this function, I am pleased to have now accepted this year the honor you do me, because later I certainly would have not been given the same chance to share time with such a dynamic group as yours.

My Regional Presidency year in 1952-53 has really marked me with the indelible seal of Junior Chamber, and got me, in contact with sincere friends, delightful hours we enjoy together again each year, in a family dinner.

Tonight, however, you crown me with this Presidency-which transfuse with the youth that I still believe I have inside of me. At your side, I feel again that crazy virus that is Junior Chamber, crazy virus that generates legitimate ambitions and necessities projects for the good of the community.

The term "crazy" Junior Chamber will without doubt surprise many: especially the ladies who indeed must at times find their husband a little crazy to get excited like this. Know, dear ladies that this is the most beautiful disease that a young man can contract! First, it is not chronic and heals spontaneously after 8 to 10 years, and then it makes no complication which leaves the patient disabled or handicapped. Instead, this temporary insanity tends to produce immunization against more dangerous germs like indifference, selfishness and hardness of heart.

Today, your husband, fiancé or boyfriend is crazy and sick ... But tomorrow, you will realize that the real crazy and sick people are those who deny their moral, social and family, those who live only for themselves, which do never gives and therefore never receive, those who are proud of deceiving their neighbours, and that society recognize as those who are good to avoid the laws!

Blessed are you, Junior Chamber friends if your heart is completely taken by this beautiful movement, for I tell you, when you leave the Junior Chamber, we must face the dangers of the jungle sneaky so-called modern society. You will be betrayed by former colleagues who once told they were your friends, but have never joined the Junior Chamber movement.

You will be postponed or rejected by hypocrites, they are often called diplomats, because that you honesty will bother them. At these times, you will doubt your ability to cash-all these affronts, and only your unwavering faith in your life principles, principles that you have acquired or ripened within Junior Chamber Creed, only with this faith, I say, will give you the strength to fight and resist the maxims of the world and human foolishness.

Christ, in his Sermon on the Mountain, taught the first bliss: "blessed are the poor in spirit because the kingdom of heaven belongs to them: "I dare say, inspired by the sacred text:" Blessed are the crazy Junior Chamber members because their future will be wonderful"

Yes, your future will be wonderful, because you will be trained to carry out your responsibilities at the command center that the society will offer you, your future will be wonderful because you will know how to fight immorality and pride of our time, then your future will be wonderful because you know and cultivated sincere friendship and the joy of giving without asking in return.

After 10 years of living the Junior Chamber life, I wish you a joy as great as the one I've experienced myself. Thank you.

Monsieur le President: Messieurs les Anciens - Presidents - Invites d'honneur – Mesdames, Mesdemoiselles & Amis Jeune Commerce.

Lorsqu'en 1949, les intrigues de Lucien Lèvesque et de Fernand Lanouette m'ont porté à la présidence du Jeune Commerce local, j'avais peine à croire qu'un nèc-Capien de deux ans pouvait m'èriter un tel honneur, et je l'ai dit en termes non équivoques aux membres d'alors.

Heureusement pour la Jeune Chambre, on avait également eu soin de m'ècadrer de bons directeurs qui me firent bien parafre, car le travail ne les effrayait pas. On a dit que mon année fut un succès; pour ma part j'avais servi de mon mieux, mais n'avais nullement l'impression d'être marqué par le Jeune Commerce, meme si j'apprécias les enseignements du mouvement.

Dix ans après cet événement mémorable de ma vie, je suis encore président du Jeune Commerce du Cap! Honoraire seulement; pour le plus grand bien des membres; Comment suis-je encore dans la galerie après une retraite de quatre ans? De toutes les réflexions que je me suis faites, je n'ai tiré aucune conclusion certaine. Peut-être l'exécutif actuel a-t-il eu un moment d'aliénation mentale; quoiqu'il en soit, pour le mieux et pour le pire, le Jeune Commerce m'a encore hissé sur le parvis; et encore ici, je me considère le plus chanceux des présidents honoraires; En effet, après seulement deux contrats avec les membres, je me revois directeurs frais émoulu 1949.

Le dynamisme de votre président, René Montreuil; l'enthousiasme délirant de Simon Grenier; la verve, la franchise et le dévouement de Denis Guérin, ce porteur de pain à la mimique incomparable; Le désintéressement et la sincérité de Jeannot Guy et de Denis Morin, anciens adversaires au football et au hockey; le prestige Jacques Hébert au verbe impeccable; la volonté de connaître enfin de tous ces Jeunes Commerce; tout cela me ramplit d'admiration et de fierté.

Mes amis du Jeune Commerce, si j'ai accepté avec inquiétude d'être votre président honoraire, à cause de l'inconnu de cette fonction, je me réjouis maintenant d'avoir accepté dès cette année l'honneur que vous me faites car plus tard je n'aurais certainement pas coudoyé un groupe aussi pétillant que le votre.

Mon année de présidence régionale en 1952-53 m'a réellement marqué du sceau indélébile du Jeune Commerce, et m'a procuré, au contact d'amis sincères, des heures délicieuses que nous savourons à nouveau ensemble chaque année, dans un dîner de famille.

Ce soir toutefois, vous couronnez ma carrière Jeune Commerce par cette présidence qui me transfuse la jeunesse que je crois toujours avoir. À votre contact, je me sens de nouveau inoculé du virus de cette folie Jeune Commerce, génératrice d'ambitions légitimes et réalisatrice de projets nécessaires pour le bien de la communauté.

Ce terme "folie Jeune Commerce" en surprend sans doute plusieurs, surtout chez les dames qui, en effet, doivent à certains moments trouver leur mari un peu fou de s'enthousiasmer ainsi. Sachez, chères dames et demoiselles, que c'est la plus belle maladie qu'un jeune homme puisse contracter. D'abord elle n'est pas chronique et guérit spontanément au bout de 8 à 10 ans; puis elle n'apporte aucune complication qui laisse le patient invalide ou handicapé. Au contraire, cette folie temporaire tend à produire une immunisation contre les microbes bien plus dangereux de l'indifférence, de l'égoïsme et de la dureté du cœur.

Aujourd'hui, votre mari, fiancé ou ami est le fou, le malade; demain vous réalisez avec lui que les fous dangereux sont ceux qui singent à renier leurs obligations morales, sociales et familiales; ceux qui vivent pour eux-mêmes, qui ne donnent jamais et donc ne reçoivent jamais; ceux qui sont fiers de tromper leur prochain et que la société considère d'autant plus qu'ils ont été plus adroits à contourner les lois.

Heureux êtes-vous, amis du Jeune Commerce si votre cœur est entièrement pris par ce beau mouvement; car je vous le dis, lorsqu'on le laisse ce Jeune Commerce, il nous fait affronter les dangers sournois de cette jungle qu'on appelle la société moderne. Vous serez trahis par des anciens collaborateurs qui se disaient vos amis jadis, mais qui n'ont jamais assimilé le mouvement Jeune Commerce.

Vous serez repoussés ou écartés par des hypocrites, on les appelle souvent des diplomates, que votre franchise et votre honnêteté morale gênent et tracassent. À ces heures, vous douterez de votre capacité d'encaisser tous ces affronts, et seule votre foi inébranlable en vos principes de vie, principes que vous aurez acquis ou muris au Jeune Commerce dans la pratique vécue du credo; seule cette foi, dis-je, vous redonnera la force de lutter et de résister aux maximes du monde et aux bêtises humaines.

Oui, votre avenir sera merveilleux, parce que vous serez formés pour assumer vos responsabilités aux postes de commande que la société vous réserve; votre avenir sera merveilleux parce que vous saurez vaincre l'immoralité et l'orgueil de notre temps; votre avenir enfin sera merveilleux parce que vous serez connus et cultivés sincèrement et la joie de donner sans mesquiner.

Après 10 ans de vie Jeune Commerce, je vous souhaite une joie aussi pleine que celle que j'ai éprouvée moi-même.

“The Meeting of the Crew” - May 2013 - Prince George BC.

An article was published in the Canada JCI Senate Newsletter – August 2012 on Prince George, BC by Writer and Author Margaret Moffatt.

The following further information was supplied by Senator William Pekonen 3073 of Richmond, BC on the naming of Prince George. The information was discovered in a publication called “1001 British Columbia Place names” by G.P.V. Akrigg/Helen B. Akrigg and published by Discovery Press of Vancouver, BC.

Quote

Prince George – Was originally Fort George. This fort was founded by Simon Fraser of the North West Company in 1807 and named after King George III the reigning sovereign. The Indian name for this point at the confluence of the Nechako and Fraser Rivers was “Thle-et-leh”.

A visitor to Fort George in 1862 described it as “a dreary Hudson Bay Company’s trading-post, infested with dogs and Carrier Indians.” Things changed little until 1910 when there was a real estate boom in expectation of the coming of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway (now part of the Canadian National Railways system).

The construction of the railway led to a prolonged and complicated struggle among three competing town sites. However, the G.T.P.’s own new town site, “Prince George,” soon drew away population from rival Central Fort George and South Fort George. When the first civic elections were held in 1915, “Prince George” was chosen over “Fort George” for the name of the new city by a vote of 153 to 13.
