The Road I Have Traveled

I was born on Gloucester Street in Toronto on July 30th, 1938.

I began my business career at the age of ten after my father passed away. I began by selling the Globe and Mail at the Parliament Buildings at Queens Park in Toronto as well as working for the Warrell's Grocery Store and then Dudley - . I joined Eaton's in 1958 and had a number of key positions including General Manager of the Toronto Stores and the Toronto Eaton Centre store which was one of the ten largest stores in the world with over 11,000 employees. I was General Manager, Market Development; playing a key cross functional role in fostering strategic alliances and partnerships with the Canadian supply base. I was also General Manager of Woman's fashion for the T Eaton Company from 1993 – 1998.

Since 1958 I had progressively more responsible positions within the T. Eaton Co.

- i. Assistant Section Head Housewares 1960.
- ii. Section Head HouseWares 1960
- iii. Senior Section Head HouseWares 1961
- iv. Assistant Department Manager HouseWares 1963
- v. Department Manager Yonge Toronto Shop 1973
- vi. Store Manager – Annex Budget Store 1976
- vii. Group Sales and Merchandise Manager Popular Price Fashion 1979
- viii. Group Sales and Merchandise Manager Woman's Fashion 1981
- ix. General Market Manager Southwestern Ontario 1983

I became executive Director of the Canadian Retail Institute/Retail Council of Canada as well as beginning the process with my dear friend the late Tony Lamantia of creating a learning organization to train future merchants to help raise the profile of retailing as a profession.

The Canadian Retail Management Education Program established a partnership between Ryerson and Eaton's. This led to a bachelor's degree in retailing at Ryerson. This education program is a first university level professional program designed from the ground up for retail management in Certificate and Baccalaureate educational programming for the whole retail sector. This led to a Bachelor of Commerce in Retail Management at Ryerson. I was instrumental in initiating the Eaton/ SSHR/ NSCRC chair in the management of technological change in retailing at Ryerson University.

I also developed Retail Standards and Certification with my friend Don Beaumont for the retail sales associates and first level managers. I also with my friend at Ryerson Phil Schalm received numerous requests for speaking engagements at corporate university seminars throughout Canada and the United States based on my book *The Eaton Legacy, Reinventing Retail Education*. This partnership between Ryerson and Eaton's has been acknowledged by the Conference Board of Canada as well the Retail Council of Canada and the U.S Based National Retail Federation and Harvard business school, for its program content and distant delivery methods. This partnership raised over \$15.3 million dollars to support its launch.

When Eaton's filed for CCAA Company Creditors Arrangement Act I began the process along with Patrick Wilson and Peter Hayden of representing the Eaton's retirement annuity plan and the Eaton Super Annulation Plan for Designated Employees which resulted in Eaton Employees Sharing \$237,000,000.

I also developed with support from the Federal Government a career planning manual which helped over 11,000 Eaton Employees in dealing with change as Eaton's went into bankruptcy.

Since my early teens I have played an active role in my community.

I first met my lifelong friends Bashir Al Rawas, a Syrian Arab, Ram Jalan, an Indian Hindu, and Mike Grinblat a Romanian Jew and Me being an Irish Canadian Christian. At the Toronto Jaycees we established the humanitarian work award presented yearly.

I have also supported Stratford, and Shaw festivals.

I have had a wonderful life but I always said the high lights were:

3. The rewarding experience volunteering at Yonge St. Mission
4. The experience volunteering at the Toronto Junior Board of Trade when I inducted the first five female members.
5. The experience raising over a million dollars for a chair at the University of Toronto in Heart Research
6. The experience of raising over 15.3 Million to establish a chair in Retailing and assisting in developing a Bachelor of Commerce degree in Retail Management at Ryerson and establishing the Eaton Chair in Retailing at Ryerson
7. Representing Eaton Employees in sharing \$237,000,000 as a result of Eaton's Bankruptcy
8. Helping over 11,000 Eaton employees with career planning after Eaton filed for Bankruptcy.
9. Helping the Right Honorable Joe Clark become Prime Minister of Canada.
10. Enjoying the Choral Music of the Elmer Isler Singers which began during my youth at Immanuel Baptist Church and singing in the Kiwanis Music Festival Choir and at Central Technical School.
11. My enjoyment of sharing sports with my sons.
12. Receiving the Queen Elizabeth II Silver and Diamond Jubilee medal in Recognition of my contribution to Canada.
13. The small role I played in the Civil Rights Movement was when me and my close black friend from Ryerson Leon Richardson who is from Bermuda, traveled, into the United States when three young Civil-Rights workers were arrested abducted and killed in the summer of 1964.
