President's Message

To all Senators and Maple Leafs as I sit down to write this article the temperature outside is climbing fast to a high today of 35c and the humidity making it feel like 42c. I guess summer is not over with yet. Tomorrow Joan and I are leaving for Bettendorf, Iowa for the USA JCI Senate Fall Board Meeting and they have 30c plus temperatures all this week, more to follow on our trip.

There has been some confusion regarding the Canada JCI Senate National Crew Meeting; the ONLY sanctioned National meeting of the Canada JCI Senate is the Annual Meeting of the Crew to be held next Year in Ajax, Ontario on September 18 - 21 2014. This is the only meeting where the Senate business and election of new officers for the Canada Senate will take place. This is the change made, as to the date of our next Canada JCI Senate General meeting, as won by the bid of the Durham JCI Region Senate group.
