I understand that funding for the Canadian President to ever attend any ASAC meetings presently could not be considered because of the high cost but a gesture of support might be in the offering. Membership cost is nominal, so E-Mail me your thoughts.

Senators may or may not be aware that there is a proposal by some Senators (essentiality from the Durham Senate Group) to change our "Terms of Reference" so that our Crew Meeting would be changed and held at the same time as the JCI Canada Annual Meeting, which is the 3rd week of September. JCI Durham is bidding for the JCI Canada Annual Meeting for 2014 and proposes that the 2014 Crew Meeting be the first year of this change. This change would require approval of our assembly in Prince George in May 2013. St. Andrews, Nova Scotia JCI Senators also seeks to host our Crew Meeting in May 2014. As you know I favour a much more re-aligned relationship with JCI Canada, but presently I do not favour the initiative. I will need more information and certainly an assurance that the Canada JCI Senate Crew

Meeting requirements will be satisfied during any JCI Canada National Meeting. I will be attending JCI Canada's Annual Meeting in Kimberly in September and I will take an opportunity to speak with current Jaycees who are also Senators to get their input. I also want your input; please email me your thoughts.

Senator E.J. (Red) Hill 2538 – New Zealand

The following article has been published from the New Zealand JCI Senators Inc. June 2012 Newsletter and was submitted by Senator Geoff Friend 5743 on a Mosgiel Jaycee Christmas Tree project a long time ago and dedicates his story to Senator E.J. (Ted) Hill 2538, the inaugural Mosgiel Chapter President 1955.

I very much doubt if many of you will know Ted Hill. When the Mosgiel chapter was launched in 1955 he was the inaugural President. He was by profession the Assistant County Engineer for the Taieri County Council. I transferred from Dunedin chapter to Mosgiel in 1961 by which time Ted was very much a father figure (at the age of 38)! But I'd like to tell you this little story which says much about the character of Ted Hill and the way in which Jaycee could provide the four tenets – fellowship, action, service and education.

In November of that year our Community Services convener decided that Mosgiel should have a decorated Christmas tree to brighten up his place. The chapter agreed and permission was given by the Borough Council to erect and decorate a Christmas tree in the little park on the main street. If we'd needed Resource consent as is now the case, we probably wouldn't have bothered. "Where will we get a tree"? - was the question. "Leave it to me" said Ted. "Where will we get the lights?" was the next question. "Leave it to George" we said. George was our resident electrician with a broad Ulster accent which rendered him unintelligible in time of crisis. That was to come.

Ted – with his local Council contacts – organized a tree. The Dunedin City Council Forestry Department would deliver it on the first Saturday morning in December. So on the designated day, about 20 Mosgiel Jaycees arrived at Mosgiel Park at 9a.m. ready for the big Christmas project. Remember that in those days there was no Saturday shopping – which was just as well. George had organized the lights – what looked like 5 miles of cable to which 10,000 lights were attached, sat on the grass awaiting the arrival of the tree. After 15 minutes of standing around yarning and scratching oneself, the President asked Ted "where's the Tree?" He said "don't worry, it's on the way". It must have been a long way because it wasn't until 10 a.m. that a DCC land rover pulled into the park. Out hopped the driver went to the back of the rover, lifted the flap and with one arm pulled out a sapling pine about 3 feet in height. He stood back and said "there – whaddya think of that?" We gawped in amazement and then we told him, what we thought of it.

George the electrician said "where am I gonna stick all these lights" so we told him too. Ted had a quiet word with the driver of the land rover who roared off in a slightly miffed state. Ted turned to the assembled Jaycees and said "don't worry fellas, leave it to me." We had every intention of doing so. Ted went to the back of his council truck and unloaded a series of picks, shovels and spades. "Right" he said, "Ten of you get cracking and dig a hole into which we can plant a decent sized tree. Two of you come with me on the truck."

At 10:15 Ted and truck disappeared in the direction of the DCC Forestry HQ. Ted knew he was safe in leaving us because he had great faith in the work ethic of the average Jaycee. Mind you, he was taking a substantial risk because the two local pubs had opened – as was the case in those days – at 9a.m.

We slaved away digging this hole and around 11:00 Ted's truck returned with a tree! It was HUUUUGGGGE!!!!!! It lay on the back of the truck, it must have had a diameter of about 3 feet, the top overhung the driver's cab by about 3 feet and the base of the trunk hung off the back by a similar margin.

"There we are boys" said Ted – "isn't it a bloody beauty?" "She sure is Ted, but how do we the hell do we get it off the truck?" Ted scratched his head and said "leave it to me – can someone give me a lift down to the county yard?" The President volunteered to drive Ted away, while the rest of us looked at the tree, looked at the hole we'd dug and then picked up the shovels with renewed panic to enlarge it.

Five minutes later we heard this strange engine noise and the next moment into the park roared the Taieri County's mobile crane, with Ted's offsider at the controls. Ted pulled out two lengths of rope; the first is tied around the trunk of the tree and attached to the crane, the other tied around the trunk about the middle as near as Ted could estimate. 'OK lads, what we'll do is: lift the tree off the truck and we'll swing it with the crane so it's hanging over the hole.' Great except that it would be hanging horizontally. Ah ha, Ted had worked that out. He got his driver to lift the tree off the truck and there it was swinging about 20 feet above the hole. Ted grabbed the second rope which was hanging down to the ground and gave us the instructions – his crane driver would lift the tree higher, whilst we would all pull on the rope and guide the base of the tree down into the hole.

Ted is in #1 position on the rope – our leader and we all line up behind him and start to pull as the driver raises the crane and lifts the tree in the opposite direction. But – panic, the balance wasn't right. And as the tree was lifted by the crane,

instead of the base coming down in response to our tugging - it kept wanting to go in the opposite direction. Up! And Ted as the leader of the cause yelled "hang on fellas!"

Which we did for as long as possible, but finally the strain was too much and we all fell off the rope except gallant old Ted, who maintained a grim hold as the base of the tree shot up and left Ted swinging six or seven feet above the ground. What leadership! We lay on the ground laughing our heads off as Ted swung back and forth. "Hang on Ted!" we called. Ted finally had to drop - not only to the ground, but straight into the hole we'd dug for the tree. Fortunately he wasn't injured. Fortunately we finally got the tree in place. George decorated it with his lights and we all went off to the local to rejoice.

That project had everything. **Fellowship** – talk about a laugh a minute. **Action:** by the mile. **Service** – well we thought we were doing something for the town and **Education** – we never brought a tree.
