Pacific Region Jaycee Foundation

In 1980-81 the Pacific Region Jaycees were having money troubles. We were several thousand dollars short of balancing our budget. A decision was made to have a fund raising project, but in order for it to be successful, it would have to be carried out in the Greater Vancouver area. The approval and co-operation of the "Lower Mainland District" units would be required. At a Regional meeting in New Westminster the matter was put to the Lower Mainland units and approval was received. Although the ensuing 30+ years fuzzes the mind a bit, I think Senator 29360 D'Arcy Burke (now in Gibson, BC) was instrumental in achieving the approval. D'Arcy – for those that haven't had the pleasure of his company – is close to 7 feet tall, a big man, and looks like death warmed over and can scare the sh@t out of new Jaycees. He still looks mean; just older now, like the rest of us, but he's now a pussy cat.

The fund raising project was sponsorship of a circus, very popular in the 1980's. The campaign no sooner got underway than Canada Post went on strike. In addition to the public agreeing to purchase tickets they were then required to deliver the funds to the promoters as mail service was non-existent. (I am biting my tongue after typing that last sentence.) The end result was that we raised enough money to not only pay off our deficit and fund the 1980-81 year, but we had \$40,000 "left over".

Working with Senator Glyn Williams and our honorary (therefore unpaid) Legal Counsel Don Linge we created and incorporated the Pacific Region Jaycee Foundation. With approval of the Region, we put the \$40,000 into the Foundation. The idea was that 90% of the interest would be paid annually to the Region and the balance left to increase the pot. This was in the days when you could actually see the interest results and they were meaningful.

The Foundation continued on for around 30 years. I found out a few years ago that the money had been moved over to the Canada JCI Foundation (better management) and annually that Foundation pays somewhere north of \$3,000 to the Pacific Region Jaycees.

There are a lot of Senators in BC that were part of this process and helped in making the right decision. I thought it would be a good idea to let them know that what we did in 1980-81 is still alive and providing assistance to Pacific Region.

2011 MEETING OF THE CREW FINALLY WINDS UP – Senators David W Trace 27821/Daniel R McLaren 46533

The final transaction of the 2011 Meeting of the Crew wound up this month. This was the sending of a cheque for \$4,725.26 to JCI Canada.

Those Senators that were in Victoria will recall that Honored President Senator 46533 Dan McLaren of Prince George, BC, donated \$2,500.00 towards the rejuvenation of the Victoria Jaycees. During Dan's Jaycee career he had been a Member of the Victoria Jaycees as well as other units.

The Crew Meeting ended up with a profit of \$2,225.26. The Board of Directors considered a wind-up Board meeting in Vegas which would have cost \$2,225.00, but instead decided to add to Dan McLaren's gift.

The money now headed to JCI Canada has two conditions: (1) For five years the sole purpose of the money is to rejuvenate the Victoria Jaycees and (2) if that doesn't happen then it can be used to rejuvenate or create a unit in the BC and Yukon Region.

I have just returned from a trip to Cocoa Beach, Florida where I attended the US JCI Senate Winter Board Meeting. As usual, I was treated royally. About 350 delegates were in attendance. It rained the first couple of days but once it cleared up it was unbelievable...Even Blair would have removed his jacket. There were about 10 delegates from ASAC including the President from Mexico and others from Central and South America. Also in attendance were Europeans from Germany, Finland and the United Kingdom. This is the function at which the candidates for National office are announced and to no one's surprise, there is only one candidate for each position.
