The Road we Travel

60 Years a Jaycee...50 Years a JCI Senator...Bill Edwards 4257

When Bill Edwards joined the Oshawa Jaycees in 1954 he looked up to Oshawa Presidents Chick Hewitt and Jerry Rutherford and their leadership teams, actively engaged young men in those days, working together building a better community and importantly developing personal skills that they would carry with them for a life time. Bill was a young businessman working at General Printers in Oshawa . The Jaycees in Oshawa were well known for their Home Builders Fair at that time, a project that would have a huge spin off in Bill's life in later years.....

Bill and his wife Joan celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary in the spring of 2013, raised 7 children, enjoyed many community leadership roles from Joan's involvement in the Girl Guides, Cancer Society to a very successful teaching career. Bill has made numerous contributions to minor sports, Jaycees and community involvement programs. It was at the President's Ball in 1964 that Bill Edwards was awarded his JCI Senatorship in recognition for his contributions to the organization and the Oshawa community. The Bill Edward's story needs to be told to hold its place in Durham Region history but importantly to help the Jaycees move forward with knowing where they have been.

Bill in his 81st year today still lives in Whitby. He and Joan have enjoyed many wonderful Caribbean cruises, many road trips and are looking forward to a family reunion in Saskatchewan this summer. With family coming first, then his career in business for 42 years, followed by his active life in Jaycees Bill Edwards remains an active and involved JCI Senator. Bill was recently honoured by the Durham Region Senate at their Senior Senator Recognition Night and was given an opportunity to highlight his Jaycee career.

The Bill Edwards story goes into great detail about Jaycee projects in the community and the impact Jaycees had on communities and individuals. The problems were similar in the 1960s but how the Jaycees of that era handled the opportunities seems to be the difference. It was with pride and still excitement in his voice that Bill speaks of fishing trips to Rice Lake where one year they actually put a boat in the water ! The Oshawa Traffic Safety Week was a Jaycee sponsored event with " local garages", where Jaycees held 1960 style automobile inspections on the streets. The Oshawa Police provided silver dollars to drivers recognized for safe driving and the Jaycees promoted "Light up Your Way to Safety", a front runner to today's running lights on automobiles. A bicycle rodeo, safety checks and registrations were also part of the program. The Jaycees ran a large Christmas tree sales lot, sold springtime "5 String Corn brooms" throughout neighbourhoods and averaged over \$15,000 per year at the Jaycee bingo. (Now you know where the silver dollars came from !) Programs like the Quebec student exchange, Election Forums, Quebec Jaycees Weekend in Oshawa, and monthly newsletters all rounded out a very busy community involvement portfolio. Bill recalls the Effective Speaking program under Senator Don Brown #724(d) having Senator Fred Upshaw#5265 as the star candidate. An emphasis on strong executive training programs helped insure leadership skills development. Jaycees met every other Monday for a dinner and business meeting (\$2.50) in the Genosha Hotel, with committees meeting at least monthly in homes, along with ways and means projects, and individual development programs. Bill shares his memory of how The Oshawa Times reporter really liked the Jaycees and helped out with publicity of events. Not a tough concept to figure out when the Jaycees brought him a story each week with a few cups of coffee and donuts.(would they be plain or sugar coated ?) The Jaycees of Senator Bill Edward's era also maintained an office in downtown Oshawa, recruited members, recognized the importance of Jaycee albums and awards and took great pride in seeing members rise to higher levels in government, the Chamber of Commerce and the Jaycee organization. Michael Starr #1298(d) Member of Parliament and Minister of Labor, Hayward Murdock, Mayor City of Oshawa, Bruce Mc Arthur, Oshawa City Councillor were all Jaycees that continued to move forward with their beginnings founded in the Oshawa Jaycees.

Like many Jaycee members Bill has a story to tell about the application of his Jaycee training. He shares that his Jaycee experience encouraged, assisted and directed some thirty families into new homes in the development of the Willow Park subdivision, built by the Lawlor Homebuilders Co-Operative in Whitby. Bill's Jaycee training that developed his leadership skills assisted greatly in getting the approvals for this development, developed personal financial plans for individuals, secured the land purchase and subdivision planning, well drillings, and organized the 30 hours of donated labour for 26 weeks before the first family moved in. Following the completion of this subdivision ,three more subdivisions were completed using this model, a true testament to a job well done.

You'll find Bill today still supporting the organization, softly suggesting they do more in the community and develop a presence with strong media support, watching his favorite sport of lacrosse and quietly admiring a tree and plaque located in the Whitby Town Garden recognizing the contributions he and Joan have made to family and the community.

Congratulations Senator #4257. We are proud of the Jaycee legacy you have shared and the road you have travelled.

We have to wonder who will be at the President's Ball in 2014 receiving a Senatorship. 1964 doesn't seem like that long ago.....
