Dear Barney – As I told you on the telephone in March 2014 I found an old speech that I gave a week after becoming a JCI Senator in October 1961. The speech was delivered at Kingsville Jaycee (my home unit) at the Ladies Night Dinner and Dance which was held at the Lakeshore Terrace Hotel. If I remember correctly it was during my second term of District President of District 1 Ontario Jaycees. Arthur H Murcott 2495 was President of District 2. There still maybe some Senators who will remember those days and the great memories. Thanks for the great job that you do, it is much appreciated and all the best.

The award was initially made in Windsor last week, I felt tremendously grateful and honored and also completely speechless. Tonight I feel tremendously grateful and honored but I feel it only fair to warn you not completely speechless. I have had time to sort out in my mind some of the events which have lead up to this rare honour.

Ours is a unique organization in that in only eight years I have become a so called old timer. It was precisely eight years ago this month that I attended my first Jaycee meeting – right in this building as some of you may remember. I was a rather shy – quiet ember who kept his opinions to himself. I weighed about 50 pounds less and had considerably more hair. Mary Edith and I were newlyweds.

Somebody said to me that night and I can't remember whether it was President Bob Quick or Vice President Jake Dick. They both impressed me with their easy outgoing manner and ability to express them-selves that the Jaycees would do wonders for me if I was willing to apply myself and work. I applied myself and worked.

It was just about five years ago that I stood here before you as your President and I found a copy of the speech that I made that night and in it asked for the co-operation of the Jaycees wives. The response was overwhelming- before the year was out every Jaycee wife in town had either had a baby or was waiting for one. In that speech I compared the Jaycees to a girl's brassiere. I said that it was a wonderful thing for a young man to get into and that you only got out of it what you put into it. I told you that Mary Edith had swallowed a watermelon

March 1958 saw me running hard for District President. Some of you may recall this, but of propaganda and the sugar sack signs. President of District 2 that year was Arthur Murcott and he visited here in September at Kingsville's Fall Conference.

Then it was a year of relative inactivity and then another term as District President, this time under the excellent leadership of the man who made Ontario Province Arthur Murcott. The best man we ever had.

To become a Senator is a long held ambition of mine – now happily realized. I am very proud to join the ranks of distinguished Senators and very happy with the honour you have bestowed upon me. Thank you.

CANADA JCI SENATE - TERMS OF REFERENCE 2014

Proposed Changes

POLICY 2: ASSOCIATION AND AFFILIATION

Section 2-4 add The Canada JCI Senate is an independent organization, with its own Terms Of Reference, associated with JCI Canada and Junior Chamber International. The purposes of the Senate include:

- * Assisting and mentoring Jaycees.
- * Promoting fellowship among its members.

Comments

This enshrines the original intention of the founders of the Senate in 1974 and is consistent with the motion passed by the Canada Jaycees Board of Directors in the same year to approve the formation of the Canada JCI Senate. It also is consistent with the governance practices of the Canada JCI Senate which has operated as an independent organization throughout its 40 year life. For information, the US Senate By-Laws include the same statement

POLICY 5: ELECTION

Section 5-1 where it reads - Annual Meeting Changes to read: Annual General Meeting

Section 5-12 reads: The annual elections are for a one year term. No elected member of the Executive may serve more than one year in any one office.

Change to Elections of elected members of the Executive shall take place at the Annual General Meeting. The terms of office of elected members of the Executive shall commence at the close of the Annual General Meeting at which they are elected and terminate at the close of the next Annual General Meeting. No elected member of the Executive may serve more than one term in any one office.

POLICY 6: GOVERNMENT

Section 6.5 Reads: The Finance Advisor shall review the financial operations of the Senate for the previous year, prepare and present a report to the Annual General Meeting as a result of that review and prepare a proposed budget for the next fiscal year.

Change to The Finance Advisor shall review the financial operations of the Senate for the previous term, prepare and present a report to the Annual General Meeting as a result of that review prepares a proposed budget for the next fiscal term.

Sections 6-10 Reads: That partial registration (Friday / Saturday) and two night's accommodation be paid for the President or his or her representative for the JCI Canada /JCI du Canada Nation Convention.

Change to That partial registration (Thursday-Friday-Saturday) and up to three nights' accommodation be paid for the President or their representative for the JCI Canada/JCI du Canada National Convention.

POLICY 7: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Sections 7-2 reads (2) The President shall appoint a Webmaster and an Ambassador to the US JCI Senate on a yearly basis.

Change to (2) The President shall appoint a Webmaster and an Ambassador to the US JCI Senate for "The President's" term of office.

Section 7-3 to 7-6(2) where it reads - Annual Meeting Change to read: Annual General Meeting

POLICY 8 MEETINGS

Section 8-1 where it reads - Annual Meeting Change to read: Annual General Meeting

Section 8-16 where it reads - by July 30 of current year
Change to read: within two months of last Annual General Meeting

Section 8-18 to 8-20 where it reads - Annual Meeting Change to read: Annual General Meeting

POLICY 11: PUBLICATION

Section 11-2 where it reads - Annual Meeting Change to read: Annual General Meeting

SECTION 12: FINANCE (Add new Section)

- Section 12-1 That the Canada JCI Senate establishes a Reserve Fund to hold operating surpluses.
- Section 12-2 That funds in the Reserve Fund shall be deposited in a separate Reserve Fund bank account and that all cheques drawn on the Reserve fund be signed by three members of the Executive.
- Section 12-3 That funds from the Reserve fund shall only be expended after approval by the membership at an Annual Meeting of the Canada JCI Senate. Sixty (60) days is required of any proposed expenditures from the Reserve Fund. Notice shall be given by publication in the Canada JCI Senate/Senat du JCI Canada Newsletter.
- Section 12-4 That in the event of an emergency, the Executive may spend funds from the Reserve Fund. Such expenditure shall require the approval of three of the four members of the Executive.
- Section 12-5 That any such emergency expenditure shall be ratified by a simple majority vote of the members in attendance at the next Annual Meeting of the Canada JCI Senate. In the event that such expenditure is not approved, the funds shall be returned to the Reserve Fund from the operating account of the Canada JCI Senate.
- Section 12-6 That the Reserve Fund be established with a deposit of \$15,000.
- Section 12-7 That starting with the 2007-2008 fiscal year, 75% of the year's operating surplus shall be transferred to the Reserve Fund.
- Section 12-8 That the % of the operating budget to be transferred to the Reserve Fund may be amended by the membership at any Annual Meeting of the Canada JCI Senate.
- Section 12-9 The Canada JCI Senate auditor shall present an accounting for the Reserve Fund in his audited statements for each fiscal year of the Canada JCI Senate.

Comment

This is a housekeeping change. The new Section 12 was approved by a series of motions approved at the Annual Meeting of the Canada JCI Senate held in Burlington, ON - May 17, 2008. They were never added to the Terms of Reference and this amendment corrects that oversight. The auditor has been reporting on the status of the Reserve Fund in his annual report.
