One of the concerns of the New Directions Committee is the low number of voting Senators at the Annual Meeting of the Senate. In Prince George it was 15 and in Ajax 42. This means that a very small number of Senators are making decisions for the silent majority. One of the suggested solutions to this situation could be a form of proxy voting where Senators could vote online or by telephone. The New Directions Committee is currently exploring the ramifications of this solution.

Before the committee spends a lot of time on their research, they would like some feedback on whether Senators would look favorably on this possible solution. Within the next two weeks you will receive an online ballot asking for your opinion on proxy voting. You will be able to answer YES or NO. Note that this vote is not binding. A decision to move to a proxy voting system would have to be approved at the Annual Meeting in Winnipeg and would be implemented at the 2016 Annual Meeting. Please help the committee by providing your feedback.
