New Directions Committee Update – Chairperson Senator Matthew Hutcheon 60917 – matt.hutchoen@gmail.com

Fellow Senators: I wish to thank those of you who have taken the time to review the Committee's report by now. Many of you have contacted me to express your appreciation for the effort and commitment demonstrated by the Committee in producing it, and those notes have been much appreciated.

Included in this month's newsletter is notification of the **potential** changes to the Terms of Reference that we believe are required to implement the recommendations presented by the Committee in the report. Among the many recommendations we propose, only a couple of them will actually require any amendments to the Terms of Reference, as many of them are more of an operational nature.

These proposed changes are presented here in blocks associated with a particular recommendation proposed. That way, if a particular recommendation is NOT approved by the assembly, then that related block of proposed changes to the Terms of Reference simply falls off the agenda when those changes are to be considered.

The process in May will be such that the recommendations in the report are considered, debated and approved or defeated first, and then any required formal changes to the Terms of Reference will subsequently be dealt with later in the agenda for those recommendations which were approved. These draft changes to the Terms of Reference are presented here as if all of the recommendations were approved, in order to provide the proper notice in advance of the AGM in May

of all the potential changes. However, the assembly at the time will still have the ability to approve all, some or none of the report's recommendations, and therefore all, some or none of these proposed changes to the Terms of Reference, at the Crew Meeting.

The recommendation which has the most impact on the Terms of Reference is alternating the location and timing of the official Annual General Meeting of the Senate each year between the Crew Meeting in the spring, and the JCI Canada National Convention in the fall. To be clear, both events will still happen each year - there will continue to be a Crew Meeting, and there will continue to be a Senator's program at the National Convention. But, in any one year, only one will house the official AGM of the Senate. As such, the Executive's travel paid for by the Senate will be to whichever event hosts the official AGM. The ability of the Senate to fund or subsidize the travel of the Executive to the other event which does NOT host the AGM that year will be subject to the wishes of the Senate members in approving annual budgets going forward.

We look forward to continued discussion about our report, and are eager for the conversation at the Crew Meeting in May where our recommendations will be formally debated. As always, any questions or feedback that you have is always welcome to me at matt.hutcheon@gmail.com.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO TERMS OF REFERENCE

Re: Executive naming new appointees to aid in the expanding of newsletter content:

6.4 – add subsection “(5) Appoint directors, liaisons, webmaster, electronic newsletter editor and other positions related to Senate communications as required”.

Re: implementing an absentee voting system:

Section 5-13 Change it to the following: “Voting credentials will be handed out to all eligible voters in attendance at the annual general meeting as a Standing Order of the Day which, will be the second item of business. Voting credentials for those members casting Absentee Ballots will be sent to all eligible voters ten days prior to the annual meeting.”

Add a new section 8 – 22

Section 8 – 22 The Canada JCI Senate Executive shall maintain an Absentee Ballot system as per the approved policy to enable all Canadian JCI Senators to vote at the annual general meeting of the Canada JCI Senate.

Add a new section 8-23

Section 8 - 23 All members of the Canada JCI Senate who are in attendance at the annual general meeting shall be entitled to vote on all of the agenda items. Alternatively, any member of the Canada JCI Senate shall be entitled to vote through the Absentee Ballot system on changes to the Terms of Reference; the approval of the financial statements; the election of officers; the selection of the next Meeting of the Crew; and such other matters as the Canada JCI Senate Executive shall deem appropriate.

Re: Annual general meeting alternating between Crew Meeting and JCI Canada National Convention

6.6 – change to “Travel, registration and accommodations shall be paid for the Executive to attend the conference where the Annual General Meeting is to be held (either at the Crew Meeting or at the JCI Canada National Convention as per Section 8.1). Travel expenses shall also be paid for the President or his delegate for one (1) US Senate meeting to attend either the US JCI Annual meeting or an alternate US Senate National Meeting.”

6.10 – change to “Travel reimbursement shall be paid at the current CRA (Canada Revenue Agency) allowable vehicle rate per kilometer up to a maximum of 800 Km for any mileage costs for eligible travel expenditures. “

8.1 – change to “The Annual General Meeting of this organization shall alternate annually between the Crew Meeting generally held in spring, and the JCI Canada National Convention generally held in the fall. Notice of the Annual General Meeting shall be published in the pre-convention issue of the Senate/Senat Newsletter.

8.2 – change to “That the date of the Annual General Meeting is such that there is no conflict with the US Meeting of the Crew, the US JCI Senate Annual Meeting or Mother’s Day. Recommended dates for the Crew Meeting may be the second or third weekends in April or May. The date of the JCI Canada National Convention will be established by JCI Canada.”

8.3 – change to “That the Crew Meeting commence on Friday evening and conclude with the Sunday Luncheon, and that the Sunday program includes a Prayer Breakfast with a keynote speaker. The program of the Annual General Meeting conference, when held in conjunction with the JCI Canada National Convention, will be established to leverage and participate in the JCI Canada National Convention program where possible, including meals, speakers, outings, and community and individual development opportunities. The Annual General Meeting conference, whether held at the Crew Meeting, or in conjunction with JCI Canada National Convention, will include a focus on fellowship opportunities for Senators.”

8.4 – change to “(a) That the Crew Meeting be held in Canada, alternating each year on the opposite sides of the Ontario/Manitoba border, except for those years in which no Senate Committee can be found to host the Crew Meeting in the desired part of Canada. The location of the JCI Canada National Convention will be chosen by JCI Canada.
(b) If no site is chosen at a Crew Meeting for the following year's Crew Meeting, the Executive shall have the authority to select the Crew Meeting site.”

8.8 change to “That time is provided during the Annual General Meeting for the current National President of the Junior Chamber International Canada/Jeune Chambre Internationale du Canada, or their designate, to provide an update of current Junior Chamber activities, etc.”

8.9 – change to “That a nautical theme is maintained throughout the promotion and program as much as possible for the Crew Meeting. Any theme of the Annual General Meeting conference, when held in conjunction with the JCI Canada National Convention, may be determined by conference organizers, or may utilize the theme of the JCI Canada National Convention.”

8.18 – change to “Bids to host the Crew Meeting shall be presented each year by interested groups at the Crew Meeting one year prior to the event, regardless of if the Annual General Meeting of the Senate is held at the Crew Meeting that year. The Executive will work with JCI Canada to create the host committee comprised of Senators and representatives from the JCI Canada National Convention Committee for years when the Annual General Meeting conference is held in conjunction with the JCI Canada National Convention.”

8.20 – change to “Meetings of the Executive – The Executive shall meet at the Annual General Meeting and at such other times as determined by the President. It shall be the duty of each member of the Executive to attend all Executive Meetings. Any member of the Executive who is absent without valid reason from three (3) consecutive Executive Meetings may have their office declared vacant by the Executive. Meetings of the Executive may be held by telephone or other means of communications acceptable and accessible to all members of the Executive.

Re: change in timing of term of office and fiscal year

New section 6.11 – “The fiscal year end of the organization shall be March 31.”

New section 6.12 – “Beginning in in 2019, the term of Executive offices will be the calendar year, to coincide with the terms of office of the JCI Canada National Board. Elections of the Executive each year will still be held whenever the Annual General Meeting of the Senate is held, whether at the Crew Meeting or the JCI Canada National Convention, with the term of office commencing at the beginning of the following calendar year. The Executive elected at the 2016 Annual General Meeting held at the Crew Meeting shall hold office from then until the 2017 Annual General Meeting to be held in conjunction with the JCI Canada National Convention. The Executive elected at the 2017 Annual General Meeting shall hold office from then until December 31, 2018.”

PROPOSED ABSENTEE VOTING POLICY

INTRODUCTION The Canada JCI Senate intends to implement an Absentee Voting system in 2017 that will enable Senators who are unable to attend the annual meeting of the Canada JCI Senate to have a say in the governance of the Senate. This Absentee Voting Policy will govern how the voting will take place.

The policy needs to deal with two types of voting. The first with how Absentee Voting is to be conducted over the Internet. The second must deal with Senators who don't use the Internet and get Senate Communications via Canada Post.

ABSENTEE VOTING POLICY

Voting Via the Internet

- 1) Any member of the Canada JCI Senate shall be entitled to vote through the electronic Absentee Ballot system on changes to the Terms of Reference; the approval of the financial statements, the election of officers; the selection of the next Meeting of the Crew; and such other matters as the Canada JCI Senate Executive shall deem appropriate.
- 2) The Canada JCI Senate shall use Survey Monkey for the electronic voting. (Survey Monkey is the leader in on-line surveys and voting and we have already used this successfully for the New Directions Survey).
- 3) The individual's Senate number shall be the security key to ensure there is no double voting.
- 4) At least 30 days prior to the Annual meeting all eligible Senators shall receive the following:
 - a. The names of the candidates for President and a 150-word bio of each candidate.
 - b. The names of the candidates for Vice-President and a 150-word bio of each candidate.
 - c. The names of the organizations bidding for the next year's Meeting of the Crew and a short statement outlining their bid.
 - d. Any proposed changes to the Terms of Reference and any background information on the proposed changes.
 - e. Such other matters as the Canada JCI Senate Executive deem appropriate with an explanation of the matter.
- 5) 20 Days prior to the annual meeting each eligible Senator shall receive an electronic ballot. Balloting will remain open for ten days.
- 6) The manager of the electronic voting shall provide the Secretary-Treasurer with the results of the electronic voting in the following manner:
 - a. A numerical list of the names and Senate numbers of the Senators who voted electronically.
 - b. A sealed envelope with the results of the voting. This envelope is to be opened at the start of the annual meeting.
- 7) The results for each election and amendments to the Terms of Reference shall be added to the votes cast at the meeting for each for each of these agenda items.
- 8) If there is an amendment to any of the agenda items that qualify for absentee voting, the absentee voting for that item shall not count; only the votes cast at the meeting shall count when voting on the amendment and the motion as amended.
- 9) If there are nominations from the floor or amendments to the Terms of Reference only votes cast by the Senators in attendance shall count.

Voting Via Canada Post

- 1) Any member of the Canada JCI Senate shall be entitled to vote, via a Canada Post ballot, on changes to the Terms of Reference; the approval of the financial statements, the election of officers; the selection of the next Meeting of the Crew; and such other matters as the Canada JCI Senate Executive shall deem appropriate.
- 2) At least 30 days prior to the Annual meeting all eligible Senators shall receive the following via Canada Post:
 - a. The names of the candidates for President and a 150-word bio of each candidate.
 - b. The names of the candidates for Vice-President and a 150-word bio of each candidate.
 - c. The names of the organizations bidding for the next year's Meeting of the Crew and a short statement outlining their bid.
 - d. Any proposed changes to the Terms of Reference and any background information on the proposed changes.
 - e. Such other matters as the Canada JCI Senate Executive deem appropriate with an explanation of the matter.
- 3) 20 Days prior to the annual meeting each eligible Senator shall receive a paper ballot. Ballots must be returned to the Secretary-Treasurer by ten days before the annual meeting.
 - a. The Secretary-Treasurer shall bring the unopened ballots to the Annual Meeting.
 - b. Prior to the annual meeting the Secretary-Treasurer and one other Senator in attendance (not part of the executive) shall open and tally the votes cast for each agenda item.
 - c. The results will be kept secret until the Annual Meeting.
- 4) The results for each election and amendments to the Terms of Reference shall be added to the votes cast at the meeting for each agenda item that qualify for absentee voting.
- 5) If there is an amendment to any of the agenda items that qualify for absentee voting, the absentee voting for that item shall not count; only the votes cast at the meeting shall count when voting on the amendment and the motion as amended.
- 6) If there are nominations from the floor or amendments to the Terms of Reference only votes cast by the Senators in attendance shall count.

THAT SERVICE TO HUMANITY IS THE BEST WORK OF LIFE – Senator Alan Salmon 12323

Here is an amazing story that absolutely reflects the above tenant of the Jaycee Creed. 71 years ago, this month, my uncle Don was killed in Holland during the Second World War. We never knew where he was buried. My sister Joy recently read a story about a Dutch organization that would track down the grave site of any Canadian soldier who died in Holland. She wrote to them giving Don's full name. Within a short time they wrote back that he was buried in the Bergen-OP-Zoom Canadian War Cemetery. Bergen-op-Zoom is a town in the Dutch province of Noord-Brabant, 40 kilometers north-west of Antwerp (Belgium). They contacted a Dutch family in the town and we received the following message: "We have visited your uncle's grave today and gave him the honor and respect that he deserves. We have laid flowers and lighted a candle for him. I hope that we have fulfilled your wish. We are proud that we may do that for a soldier who died for our freedom. With love - Family De Vos"

“That the ‘JCI Canada Senate Friendship Award Process and Guidelines’ be approved.”

Canada JCI Senate Friendship Award Process and Guidelines

Eligibility:-

A person who is not a Canada JCI Senator and is at least 40 years of age, who has made a special contribution in support of the aims of the Canada JCI Senate.

Nomination Process:-

A member of the Canada JCI Senate may submit the name of a potential recipient to the President of the Canada JCI Senate along with a resume of the nominee's activities that have made a special contribution in support of the aims of the Canada JCI Senate. The resume may not exceed two typed eight and a half by eleven pages and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 cheque payable to the Canada JCI Senate. If the nomination is not successful, the cheque will be returned.

Selection Committee:-

The President of the Canada JCI Senate, the immediate Past President of the Canada JCI Senate, one other Past President of the Canada JCI Senate and one current Board Member of the Canada JCI Senate.

The Selection:-

Three votes in favour of a nominee are the minimum required for selection.

Other Guidelines:-

The Award shall be presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Canada JCI Senate.

The President shall present to the recipient a framed numbered Certificate, a Canada JCI Senate pin, and a Friendship Name Badge showing the recipient's name, Friendship Award number, and year of Award.

The Certificate shall be computer designed and the computer program shall be maintained by the Secretary of the Canada JCI Senate so as to ensure continuity of the form.

The Web page of the Canada JCI Senate shall have a section that describes the Friendship Award and list of all winners. A similar section shall be added to the Canada JCI Senate Directory.

Note: - Certificate Number 1 has already been awarded to Molly Ziola.
