The Saga continues; Drumming Out 2014 Sheffield England. We left London Thursday January 16th by train to Sheffield arriving at 3pm. We stayed at the host Hotel, the Mercure Hotel. Thursday is the start, so we met a large number of people in the lobby arriving at this time, Americans, German, French, Swedish, Scottish, Norway; it is a real international affair.

The evening began with a short walk to the famous Crucible Theater, and into a room where we all enjoyed a glass of wine and a meet and greet before the musical (Lionel Bart's) 'Oliver'. I am not a critic, but the show was terrific. After the show we went to the Brown Bear Pub, on the way back to the hotel, every street has a pub or two.

The next morning we were loaded into a coach and it was off to Tideswell in the country. We saw a lot of small communities, and the stone fences dividing the fields of the farms, as we traveled over hill and dale, travelling to our destination.

Arriving at the Tideswell School of Cookery, where a competition was set up to see who could make the best Bakewell Tart or the best sausage by hand, the competition was fierce, and we all had a good time. The wine tasting session helped immensely.

Leaving the school and walking across the parking lot to the local George Hotel (pub) for lunch and a pint. Soup and sandwich was the lunch with our own fresh made Bakewell Tart for desert. As we continued having a pint or glass of wine song broke out and we were serenaded by the Tideswell Male Voice Choir. What a way to enjoy desert.

After lunch we went to another village call EYAM Parish. We stop to hear about the terrible loss of life to their families during the Plague from 1615 to 1616. A mining village from Roman occupation time, it had 350 populations and when the plague came from London in cloth sent to the village. From September 1615 to November 1616, 250 persons died complete families, a number of times only the mother was left alive.

Back to the hotel to get ready for dinner and an international curling match. Back on the bus for the arena and a substantial Sheppard's Pie with Sticky Pudding and Ice Cream and of course more wine. Teams were set up and down to the ice we went. Joan and I could not curl, so I got two people to fill in for us, I made them honoree Canadians and wrapped them in a Canadian scarf. With Ben and Jinty Jowitt as our skip and our two imports we did very well placing second to the wily German team, a lot of fun was had by all, with a few bumps and bruises and Russ Cooper's torn pants when he fell.

The next morning we went to the Kelham Island Industrial Museum in downtown Sheffield. After a tour of the steel making plant that made Sheffield famous, we had lunch (Bangers and Mash) in the foyer. A few word of greetings by various persons and a small gift exchanged. With the tour over it was around the corner to a local pub called the Fat Cat for a quick pint.

Back to the hotel and get ready to join the Bumble Bee Club. This club was started a few years ago and a number of Canadian Senators are members. Donning our one size bathing suit that fits all, we headed to the hotel pool where Ben Jowitt and I were initiated, and to celebrate we had champagne and hors d'oeuvres in the lobby bar.

At 7pm we met in the lobby, and a short walk to the Sheffield City Hall and Crucible. This black tie affair started with cocktails in a new refurbished panelled room. At 8pm the doors opened into a spectacular room, with all the round tables set and places assigned. A band was playing on the stage music from the late 30's to the 40, the theme of the dinner.
