I have just returned from the JCI Canada National Meeting, hosted by JCI Kootenay in Kimberly, BC. The last National Conference I attended was in Dundas, Ontario in 1984, which my Daughter Stephanie also attended at 5 days old. It was not known whether or not he would survive and he was put into a medically induced coma for more than three months.

Many of us who have come to know Patrick are very happy that not only did he survive, but he has remarried and has fathered a child and has resumed his career both as a JCI trainer and a US attorney. He has also authored a book about the incident. It is called "Blessed to Survive - The Thanksgiving Day Massacre". "The Meeting of the Crew" - May 2013 - Prince George BC.

When Molly and Barney were at the Fraser Downs Horse Racing, he picked up a publication called "Today's Senior's". As Barney was looking through the publication he came across a very interesting article on Prince George, BC where we will be attending the 2013 Crew Meeting. Barney sent an E-Mail to Margaret Moffatt who lives in Quesnel, BC requesting permission to publish her article in the Senate Newsletter. Margaret replied very quickly giving us her permission to do so.

The Carrier First Nations people lived along the Fraser River from North of Prince George to south of Quesnel, the Barkerville-Wells area, and others, well before towns were established.

Prince George, today, has a population of over 70,000, and boasts the largest city in northern British Columbia! It is at the meeting of the Fraser and Nechako Rivers, and where Highway 16, and Highway 97 meet.

In 1807, fourteen years after Alexander Mackenzie made his way down the Fraser River en route to the Pacific; Simon Fraser established the North West Company fur trading post of Fort George. He named his Fort for King George William Frederick 111, who reigned from October 25, 1760 until his death, January 29, 1820, at the age of eighty-two. The third British Monarch of the House of Hanover was married to Charlotte, and was known as the mad King, and the King who lost America. One can only presume news of such did not reach the explorer Fraser. (The North West Company operated the Fort, later merged with the Hudson's Bay Company).

The Cariboo Wagon road went through to Quesnel with miners, and stagecoaches going to Barkerville goldfields, and the Collins Overland Telegraph Trail, built in 1865-1867, also bypassed the fur trading post, so it seemed fortune did not come to Fort George until 1903, when the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway (later the CN) steamed passed, bringing a new settling of an agriculture region a few years later. In 1909 communities of Central Fort George, and South Fort George were developed by two rival companies. South Fort George was located on the Fraser River near the trading post of the Hudson's Bay Company, while Central Fort George was just two miles (3km) northwest on the Nechako River.

Fort George, and the newly developed town South Fort George, prospered because forestry became the main industry and sawmills were built. Through the early 1900s sternwheelers transported people and goods up the Nechako and Fraser Rivers.

In 1913, a year before the beginning of World War 1, South Fort George and Central Fort George each boasted a population of 1500, as workers on the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway came for supplies. But the railway station was not built in either town. The railway bought 1,366 acres of land between the two from the Lheidli T'enneh First Nations (People from the Confluence of Two Rivers).

Mr. Charles Millar, owner of the B.C. Express Company, was compensated with 200 acres because he was going to buy the property. When the railway was completed in 1914, there were four major communities in Fort George: South and Central, the Millar Addition, and the railway's town site Prince George where they built their station! The City of Prince George was incorporated March 6, 1915.

And where did this city of Prince George get its name? There is nobody to ask that knows. The question does come up, once in a while, by tourists who have history under their belt, but King George V was the reigning King (1910-1936) when Prince George was incorporated. No matter, tourists are always welcome in this beautiful city, Prince George
